Twin Towns gears up to switch on the lights

Don't be alarmed if you see a troop of abseilers scaling the heights of the Twin Towns building this month. It's all part of ongoing works that will see the Club become a dazzling, illuminated border landmark in early April, in time to welcome visitors to the Commonwealth Games.

The abseilers have almost 6,000 LED dots to install on

the building, along with a 16 metre by five metre, high resolution screen that will wrap around the circular wall on the exterior of the building. Behind the screen, a low-resolution backdrop, projected across the 'cotton reel' façade, will bring life and colour to the entire building. Once switched on, Twin Towns will become illuminated

by a customisable display of colour, movement and imagery.

Twin Towns CEO Rob Smith said the installation would be one of the most technologically advanced, permanent lighting displays in Australia and a first-of-its-kind for NSW registered clubs.

"Twin Towns will become a dynamic digital canvas, with images of destination highlights, photo-real videos, animations and graphics.

"I have no doubt it will be Australia's most spectacular border marker," said Rob.

The company designing, manufacturing and installing the lightshow, ULA Group with its head office on the Gold Coast, is globally recognised for its many large-scale projects, including the Marina Bay Sands in Singapore, Auckland Sky Tower and Brisbane City Hall.

ULA Group National Project Manager Russell Muddle said they are heading into the final phase of

construction and the entire team is excited to see the project coming to fruition.

"Four abseilers will work on lighting installations in early February and nightworks will commence around the middle of the month to install the seven panels which will form the screen.

"Roads closures for the screen installation should have minimal impact as these will be after-hours.

"Then, there will be several weeks of programming and testing before the screens go live in early April, provided there aren't any weather issues or delays receiving the last of the lighting components from overseas.

"After more than four years of planning, switching on the lightshow is now only a matter of weeks away," said Russell.

Once completed, Twin Towns will be illuminated from 7pm to midnight, seven nights a week.

BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

2018 is a momentous year for remembrance. The 2018 ANZAC Day Remembrance Celebration in April, the 100th year anniversary of the end of World War I and Armistice Day in November are of international importance.

Here at home, recognition of profound significance is the 100th year Anniversary of the Tweed Heads & Coolangatta RSL Sub-Branch on Friday 27 September 2018.

Under the banner of the Returned and Services League of Australia, the Tweed Heads & Coolangatta Sub-Branch really are unsung heroes doing marvellous, mostly unnoticed, work for our community.

Their 100th anniversary is an incredible accomplishment in itself, performed by dedicated community volunteers; remembering their tireless work in the establishment of the footprint for Twin Towns Services Club along the way. Much more to come during the upcoming year so watch this space.

President Mr Joe Russell, Treasurer Mr Bruce Loynes and Secretary Dr John Griffin, supported by their committee of David Bell, Kenneth Campbell, Max Greber, Norman Henstridge and Geoff Partridge, along with Secretary Jenny and the humble band of dedicated workers, never cease to amaze nor forget ex-service men and women who fought in many theatres of war for our democratic freedom.

Ex-service persons, widows and families often need assistance resolving health issues, applying for government assistance or even just a simple direction. Expertise is always available to them without hesitation from the team at the Sub-Branch, who at the same time continually maintain their office structure and lounge facility, just to ensure they are available for a chat or offer reassurance to all and sundry.

Although a separate entity to that of Twin Towns Services Club identified under the Queensland Branch of the RSLA, I am continually left in awe of this humble group who would never seek accolades nor praise for their tireless dedication and remarkable resolve to get on with the job of serving their members and the community.

I am not sure they agree with acknowledgement through this article, however, I have managed to put together information covering some of the achievements and commitments to profound

community service.

We are all well aware of the remarkable skills and organisational capacity shown with the delivery of ANZAC Day Services on 25 April and Remembrance Day Services (Armistice Day) at the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month every year, including that amazing predawn Gallipoli Landing re-enactment to celebrate the 100 years of ANZAC in 2015.

We also can't forget the incredible Anniversary Year schools' essay competition, resulting in a private plane trip to visit the National War Memorial in Canberra for 44 students and 22 Australian Navy Cadets from TS Vampire.

Many other remembrance services are conducted for ex-service reunions held locally and particularly the special funeral dedication service for ex-servicemen when requested by families within our region and even further afield. All are fulfilled without question.

Organising marches, vintage car transport, school participation, choirs, speakers, bands, light and sound equipment, the contingent from the Army Reserve, veterans' dinners, police, ambulance and Council, all take years of planning to implement.

The history of famous poem based on the poppy from Flanders Fields has seen many a Sub-Branch representative out and about in shopping centres, Gold Coast Airport and around town selling the replica poppy for remembrance and to raise money for the important community work they carry out. In future when you see these volunteers doing amazing volunteer work, please be generous.

Employment Training

A local advocate and veteran of the Rwandan Peace Keeping Mission and witness to the genocide that took place there during the '90s goes out of his way to support local veterans. Starting off with a few regulars, the word soon spread with around 30 veterans regularly catching up over a hot morning brew at Kirra. It has become a great support base, as well as watching out for one another.

One of the issues this advocate identified through interaction with local veterans was the need for suitable employment training. With that in mind a couple of mates met a local Earthmoving Contractor qualified to perform Operator Training and with a

Registered Training Organisation assisting they are ready to proceed.

The Certificate IV in Plant Operation includes training in heavy machinery use namely backhoes, bobcats, front end loaders including the addition of CPR, First Aid and Work Place Health and Safety. This locally run course is planned to run for six weeks and on completion it's anticipated these Veterans will be in high demand for a much sought-after skill. A great initiative from one of the Sub-Branch members with no cost or subsidy from the local area. A Veteran doing his best to assist other Veterans find their place in our community.

Veterans building a better community

Another program involving a mix of age and gender is the establishment of a small business assisted by the RSL Sub-Branch, led by two Afghanistan veterans with a small grant starting up a Veteran Mentoring program.

Parents having difficulties with their 12 to 17 year olds send them from all over Australia to the Gold Coast Airport where they are transported to basically a 'Boot Camp' for two weeks in the hinterland. Here they receive plenty of physical training and discipline to turn these young adults around and give them confidence, resilience and basic life skills such as cleaning, ironing, bed making, communication and the importance of teamwork.

The December 2017 class of 27 completed their training by parachuting out of a perfectly good plane at 4,000 metres (25 made the jump), landing on North Kirra Beach. A huge credit to all concerned, well done.

The Tweed Coolangatta RSL Sub-Branch make available their training rooms for parent information sessions that these veteran mentors conduct with their own welfare officers, and with other local veterans occasionally providing staffing assistance and transport, to ensure this commendable program continues. Veteran mentoring is becoming the go-to agency for parents who wish to instil into their wayward children improved attitudes and social skills, making for a better society.

The Association of Veteran Surfers

With assistance from the Sub-Branch, the Association of Veteran Surfers Inc (AVS) for local young veterans and their families, has gone from strength to strength, with a membership of 50 meeting once a month in the Tugun area for surfing and mateship.

Surfing activities for RSL Queensland with Australian Defence Force Units coming down from Enoggera for Adventure Training is also provided.

Admin Staff and the Sub-Branch welfare group assisted a couple of Afghanistan veterans to develop

the Association of Veteran Surfers who meet with local board-riding clubs. Last year they competed in the Kirra Team Challenge made up of some 32 clubs from Australia and New Zealand establishing great links and lifting their profile.

The benefits of surfing and other water-based activities are well documented and often referred to as Ocean Therapy, providing a relaxing and invigorating environment that does wonders for personal wellbeing.

Of most benefit is the camaraderie and mateship from shared experiences, with a common link helping ex-servicemen and women reconnect among their group and with the wider community.

Pension Section

This area of commitment within the Tweed Heads & Coolangatta RSL Sub-Branch is an area of most importance, with very little known of the work carried out outside the inner circle which is probably appropriate.

President Joe Russell, ably assisted by Jenny Sheehan, are arguably among the most knowledgeable in the industry, having assisted many who need help acquiring pensions and Gold Cards.

They have four Pension Officers and two level four advocates as well as a clinical Psychologist working from the Sub-Branch office.

Committee member Max Greber attended a two day Prior Learning Course at New Farm last year conducted by the new Advocacy Training and Development Program, giving him the qualification as a Welfare Mentor to train and assist new Welfare Mentors.

As a result the Sub-Branch has seven candidates under training to become Welfare Advocates. This is an e-learning course conducted by the Department of Veteran Affairs and will benefit Sub-branch members.

Computer Lessons

Ace Computers conduct groups of 25 people in two sessions daily in association with the Sub-Branch in the ANZAC Room. This service equates to tuition covering e-mail use, on-line shopping, social media and more with most attendees over 70 years. Recently Frank Birkin completed the course just a few days shy of his 100th birthday. The Sub-Branch has two computers used by approximately 500 members each year for internet connection at no cost.

Sub-Branch Library

Two volunteer librarians maintain an extensive collection of military literature and memorabilia mostly donated by ex-service families for members to view. This Library opens two days a week and offers a place for members to get out and about to meet mates, to read and to enjoy the company of others.

Welfare Officers

The Sub-Branch committee and volunteers work tirelessly looking after their members. These Sub-Branch Officers undergo Welfare

Training days that allow them to visit members on a regular basis in seven nursing homes and two hospitals in the local area, and occasionally at home.

They attend nursing homes on Remembrance Days to deliver a Remembrance Day address. They also provide care packages to those in need. With over 500 World War 2 Veteran members mostly living alone, they keep contact regularly by phone and keep these members up-to-date with Sub-Branch activities and check that their needs are covered.

Welfare Officers meet quarterly to discuss any issues that have arisen and compare notes to ensure all members are looked after. They organise and attend regular Sub-Branch meetings, organising guest speakers on a monthly basis. They attend various seminars involving Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) recognition and assistance, aged care training and general veteran information sessions.

Social Outings

Social outings are organised regularly, with up to 50 or so members attending places such as whale watching cruises, Ballina Naval Museum, Victoria Barracks in Brisbane, Ipswich Rail Museum, Tweed River Cruises. These outings are followed by lunch, usually at a local RSL or Services Club.

The committee also organises school programs, where school children visit residents in nursing homes. These 'tea and cake' morning teas really lift the spirits of our aged residents.

Special support for TS Vampire Navy Cadet Unit attending parades and award days adds to the list of the many activities of the RSL Sub Branch.

Memorial Fountain

Based on a previous article following the initial agreement between the Tweed Shire Council and the Sub-Branch in 1984 and again in 2016 to rectify the disintegration of the Memorial Fountain in Chris Cunningham Park, the quick response from the Sub-Branch, supported by Council, will see the fountain return to its glorious best in time for the ANZAC Day services in April 2018.

With the aid of grants from the Queensland, New South Wales and Commonwealth Governments, along with Twin Towns Services Club and the Sub-Branch, this great community asset of remembrance will be restored for the local community.

Directors, management and members of Twin Towns Services Club recognise and congratulate the Sub-Branch on their remarkable achievements with a commitment to support them both financially and in-kind for as long as the Club is in a position to do so, in accordance with our Constitution and Mission Statement.

Good health to all and I look forward to catching up around our Clubs.


