He also joined the Twin Towns Services Club Runners and Walkers club.

"I suppose I thought they might go easy on me but I was wrong," he laughs.

"Anyone running in retirement has been doing so over a long time. Most are exceptionally fit. I

have trouble keeping up." Mr Thompson, a married father of two teenagers from Tweed Heads, replaces Owen and Pam Pattison who retire after two years as part-time chaplains.

"They were both well loved and respected but they needed a break," he said.

Mr Thompson's appointment comes about through a three-way partnership between Twin Towns, ClubSafe NSW and The Salvation Army.

BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

ARMISTICE DAY; 11TH HOUR, 11TH DAY 11TH MONTH, 1918.

More than 10 million soldiers, sailors and airmen had died since the war began four years earlier (1914-1918) and after years of bloodshed and bombardment, peace descended eerily on Europe's Western Front at 11 am on November 11th 1918.

It was the moment the armistice agreement came into effect among Germany and the Allied Powers of France, Great Britain and the USA to end the First World War.

In total 416,000 Australians, including 57,000 Queenslanders, volunteered to serve in the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps and Royal Australian Navy as loyal members of the British Empire. However, more than 61,000 Australian volunteers never returned. They laid down

their lives on foreign fields as distant as Palestine and Pozieres in a war defined by bloody and brutal trench warfare.

To honour all Australian Servicemen who lost their lives in all international conflicts, the name Armistice Day was changed after the Second World War to Remembrance Day.

Many would remember the presentation with a profound meaning given at the ANZAC Day service earlier this year by Pastor John that should make all of us consider our values. I thought appropriate to repeat it, in part, at this time of remembrance.

"Once again we gather to give thanks to those who gave their lives in two horrific World Wars, subsequent wars and police actions throughout the world so as others we may have peace and freedom

of expression all of us enjoy in this wonderful country.

We also remember and give thanks to all those serving our nation, some returning wounded both physically and emotionally and pray our government will do more to rehabilitate those so affected by the horrors of war.

It has not been widely publicised that between January and September 2015, yes only a nine-month period, some 41 Ex-servicemen and Women returning from active service took their own lives.

This was the same number who lost their lives in the combat zones of Afghanistan and Iraq over the whole campaign period, clearly we should ask the question WHY is this possible?

Well it would appear our government of both major political persuasions are only concerned with sending our sons and daughters off to fight while on return, those emotionally wounded, ie no physical scars or loss of limb or sight are left to fend for themselves.

However, our traditional way of mateship is attempting to overcome these hurdles with such organisations as Sub-Branches and RSLs, Legacy, Mates 4 Mates,

Soldier On, War Widows and the list goes on. All established by those who have served, or a spouse, or a brother or relative of those who have served and paid the ultimate price.

This is our Australian way into which no foreign culture will intrude. Unfortunately, in our country today, there are some who wish to instil their Islamic State fundamentalist ideology by terror as seen in the UK and across Europe. Well NO, you will never defeat the ANZAC spirit.

And again today we see across our world, both in the Middle East and South East Asia, terror and turmoil, ethnic cleansing caused by mans' greed for power and domination and for some, it is either political or religious.

So once again we will be asked to defend our freedom and democracy by sending our young Australians off to protect our shores. Some may never return, some will suffer wounds, loss of sight or limb; some mentally scarred who may never be the same again."

According to recent statistics published by Soldier On, a well-known Australian organisation that assists modern-day veterans and raises awareness about the experiences and issues they

face, more than 20% of serving members will experience a mental health condition in a given year. More than 50% of veterans will experience a mental health condition in their lifetime.

Suffice to say there is always help available from many organisations such as Soldier On, including our own RSL Sub-Branch, who have steered countless veterans towards a path of receiving the help they need to recover and reconnect with family and community.

Next year is the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day, a day that was supposed to represent the end of the war to end all wars. I will leave you to ponder that thought.



Club chaplains are from the Christian tradition but can provide support to all, regardless of beliefs. They offer a listening ear and non-judgemental presence to those who need to talk through tough times.

Mr Thompson helps where he can or finds others who can. The idea is to help people change what can be changed and cope positively and peacefully with what cannot be altered.

"The role will be largely responsive though over time, I hope it will become more proactive, perhaps by putting groups into a room for

lifestyle and resilience programs." Reared in Murwillumbah, Mr Thompson looks forward to working close to home after roles that involved a daily drive to Brisbane.

"For me it's always been about local and the community so I look forward to it," he says.

Mr Thompson has tertiary qualifications in theology and social work and 20 years of Christian ministry experience in settings that include church pastoral work, outdoor education, youth work, state wide ministry

development, as well as school chaplaincy.

"Most of my experience has been in youth work. Teenagers might have different issues and a different range of challenges that need to be addressed but, for me, it's the same approach.

"I try to treat everyone I meet with dignity and respect, to be ready with a listening ear. People, whoever they are, want to be heard and known and acknowledged."



