BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Annual General Meeting

Twin Towns Services Clubs and Resorts' Annual General Meeting held on 22 May in the Showroom was once again supported by 117 very dedicated members, who are extremely passionate about their Club and who take great interest in the operation and annual financial results. On behalf of the Board and Management, I thank you very much for your continued support.

Twin Towns Directors sincerely thank members for their confidence in returning all Directors unopposed for a further term.

This term is the first of the new Triennial Election principle where our returning officer has drawn three Directors for a one (1) year term, three for a two (2) year term and three for a three (3) year term.

Following this initial term to establish the Triennial Election positions, all terms for Directors will be for terms of three (3) years, resulting in three directors elected annually.

The following three (3) directors have drawn a one (1) year term: Ken Culpitt, John Griffin and David Phillips. Mark Day, Bob Loring and Ross O'Leary drew a two (2) year term. Finally, Brian Brown, Michael Fraser and Tony Mitchell have drawn a three (3) year term.

The Board have again elected Michael Fraser as Chairperson and Brian Brown as Deputy Chairperson. The Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson will be elected annually by the Board in future after each election at all Annual General Meetings. The Board thanks those members who went out of their way to attend the Annual General Meeting

and hope you all enjoyed a light supper and some refreshments put on by the Club in appreciation.

ANZAC Day

Although 25 April was a few months ago, it would be remiss of me not to congratulate and thank the RSL Sub-Branch for organising another amazing and successful ANZAC Day of remembrance.

Our Sub-Branch committee directed by President Joe Russell, along with the many volunteers, special services, the Blenders Choir, school children, ex-service personnel and technical assistance from Twin Towns, ensured ANZAC Day was truly a remarkable day.

Twin Towns again supported the early Dawn Service ANZAC Day breakfast with all revenue raised going to support the RSL Sub-Branch. How good were those traditional ANZAC Biscuits for attendees who entered the Club for breakfast?

In addition, the growing support from thousands of people from the local community, many with small children, who managed to get up early for the Dawn Service, was a credit to the true meaning of remembrance.

The strong attendance numbers emphasised the 'Courage, mateship, sacrifice and endurance' of our ANZACs and the many other servicemen and women in all theatres of war who sacrificed so much so that we may live in relative peace. It was a remarkable statement of community remembrance and support. Lest we Forget. Congratulations and thank you to all concerned for a marvellous ANZAC Day.

Internal Clubs quarterly presentation

The quarterly update to approximately 80 committee volunteers who dedicate time and expertise to run their internal clubs took place in early May.

Information on the financial position of the Twin Towns Services Clubs and Resorts, operational issues and direction the company is taking is provided in a transparent manner with the intention that our internal committees will relate such matters to their members.

Board and Management are in attendance to answer questions on anything and everything during and after these presentations to keep our members informed.

May's presentation was

held in Signatures to allow members to view a special presentation of our sensational lighting display on the north-facing wall of the circular tower. Well worth a look should other members have the opportunity.

Video displays commence on the hour from 6pm daily and run for approximately 10 minutes, followed by 50 minutes of colourful, changing graphics and lighting which illuminate the building. This occurs every hour until midnight.

Other subjects presented were based on the hidden costs of running the business, escalating power costs, the huge jump in general insurance and an update on the Hotel refurbishment with costs, new power supply for Juniors, Tweed Shire Council Wharf Street footpath upgrade, an explanation of the Public Holiday 15% surcharge and other operational issues.

Year-to-date electricity cost is up 25% with March up 30%. YTD comparison: 2017 - \$362,000 vs 2018 \$441,000. This has occurred despite the club installing high efficiency equipment and lights, including the new LED display. General Insurance costs increased by 25% (equating to \$250,000), making the annual bill over \$1 million.

Again, this has occurred even with an extremely efficient consultant overseeing compliance and risk management best practice programs for all departments and a Board committee to ensure compliance best practice is adhered to.

Air-conditioning project upgrades: air handling unit (servicing Harbour, Lounge, Gaming, Dancefloor) to be replaced during the cooler month of July at a cost of \$180,000. Chiller replacement for end-of-life aged equipment - one of two units servicing the Millennium Tower

for new energy-efficient, environmentally-friendly technology - \$350,000.

Repairs and maintenance are ongoing to provide members with the best most modern cost-effective facilities, as well as regular refurbishment of facilities at all Clubs and the Resort.

Public Holiday Surcharge 15% and years of service

Twin Towns Clubs and Resort staff are as efficient or better than staff anywhere in the hospitality industry and all certainly deserve their remuneration.

Twin Towns has an extremely proud record for staff years of service and loyalty.

Staff under 5 years (173), staff serving 5-10 years (69), staff serving 10-15 years (50), staff serving 15-20 years (24), staff serving 20-25 years (19), staff serving 25-30 years (24), staff serving 30-35 years (18), staff serving 35-40 years (60) and one employee has over 40 years of service. It's a record that speaks for itself.

The four-day Easter weekend based on the NSW Club Award realised an additional \$140,000 in extra wages at Twin Towns, while surcharge revenue equated to \$55,000.

Clubs pay much greater penalty rates than hotels, restaurants and remaining hospitality businesses. Obviously, these penalty rates and costs of running the business are unsustainable without a surcharge or price increase. Although many restaurants charge a Public Holiday surcharge, others just close on public holidays. We certainly appreciate member support and understanding in this matter.

Good health to all and I look forward to catching up around our Clubs and Resorts.





QLD vs NSW border battle on the building

Just a few short months back, crossing the Queensland/New South Wales border at night was something you could have easily blinked, and missed. Not anymore.

Twin Towns new border light show is big, bold and has the towns talking, with locals and visitors flocking to find a perfect spot to capture the dazzling sight on their cameras and phones.

This month, the State of Origin battle erupts on the Twin Towns building. A special presentation on the giant 17 x 5 metre screen will see the exterior of the Club awash with blue and maroon in

the lead-up to each of the games. Rumour has it there may be a little more blue than maroon, but whichever side you barrack for, the screen will have it covered.

Catch the State of Origin display for 10 minutes, on the hour, every hour, from 6pm to midnight on Wednesday 6 June, Sunday 24 June and Wednesday 11 July. In between each hour, colourful graphics and digital displays will keep the cameras snapping.

As the Cooly Rocks On Festival rolls into Coolangatta and Tweed Heads in June, nostalgia-loving visitors will be greeted by a 50s

and 60s themed presentation on the screen.

The clips capture the atmosphere of Cooly Rocks On with dance scenes, footage of music legends of the 50s and 60s and colourful neons and graphics from the era.

The Cooly Rocks On lightshow runs for 10 minutes on the hour, every hour from 6pm to midnight, in the lead-up and during the Festival until Monday 11 June.

Daytime Shows at Twin Towns

Almost 40 years ago, Twin Towns first began presenting high quality daytime entertainment for members and guests in the Showroom, or 'Morning Melodies in the Auditorium' as it was known in the early days.

The Board and Management have always strived to offer these shows at the best possible price, and many daytime show ticket prices cost less today than they were 10 years ago.

To ensure Twin Towns continues to deliver the same standard of daytime entertainment for members, new ticketing procedures will be introduced to help mitigate the rising administrative costs involved in delivering daytime shows.

From Friday 1 June, book your tickets for daytime shows at www.twintowns.com.au, book on the Twin Towns App, or book in person at the Show Booking Desks on the Ground Level or Level 2 and the ticket will remain the same.

Bookings made in advance via the website, the App or in person will be \$7 for members, \$12 for non-members. On the day of the show, tickets pre-purchased online, via the App or in person will be \$10 for members and \$15 for non-members.

Bookings made by phoning 1800 014 014 will now incur a \$2 booking fee, additional to the total for your daytime show tickets purchase. (Only one \$2 phone booking fee applies, regardless of how many tickets you purchase in one transaction – one ticket, two tickets, three tickets, etc).

To avoid paying the booking fee, simply book online or in person. The Show Bookings desk on Level 2 opens Monday to Saturday 9am-5pm. The Show Booking Desk on the Ground Level opens Monday to Saturday 9am-6pm; Sunday 9am-5pm.




GOLF


