## Members Money at Twin Towns

Don't miss your chance to share in Twin Towns' massive cash bonanza when Members Money returns this month.

## BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

### DIVERSITY IS THE KEY

Our strategic plan considers that our core business of gaming, as we know it, is under intense pressure from many quarters. Changes to our core business revenue stream are inevitable, in fact, they are already upon us.

This change will most likely have ramifications for the current business model, detracting from the past 60 years of successful business that we have experienced. This means if you always do what you have always done, you always get what you have always had. Doing nothing to prepare for future generations in this instance is not an option.

In NSW, 25 Clubs have folded and 35 amalgamated in the last five years, so diversification is key for the future.

Twin Towns' event space on level three and Twin Towns Mantra Resort are examples of our plan to create diversified revenue streams. Our strategy of Land Banking for the future, particularly in Recreation Street and Boyd Street, is part of our long-term business plan to create additional revenue streams.

If it's not just gaming, what is it? Your Board has considered hotels, caravan parks and leasehold clubs, particularly in Queensland.

The commercial development proposed at Club Banora, involving the possibility of two retail centres and speciality shops, is an essential growth opportunity for the Club and community that diversifies the revenue stream.

Seniors living opportunities at Club Banora remain a much sought-after commodity in our community. A Cobaki club and childcare centre to be established when the huge housing estate gets the go ahead, is another opportunity the Board is enthusiastically pursuing.

Our industry is being told to prepare for a future where liquor and gaming are not the centre of our universe. We hope they are in some ways, but we must also look for new horizons.

When considering the many diversification opportunities, and we have looked at many, the Board is well aware of their social responsibilities, club values, and member and community expectations.

Due diligence, good governance and best business practices are adhered to and we advocate transparency and accountability in decision-making for and on behalf of our members.

At our July Strategic Planning weekend, an opportunity in Mackay was put on the table and agreed that it should be investigated. After a close inspection, it was

considered the Mackay Tavern we investigated was not the business opportunity anticipated.

However, a motel for sale in Mackay warranted a closer look. Whilst assessing this, and the broader accommodation market in Mackay, an additional 36 bed motel was suggested to be coming on the market.

After inspections, consultants were engaged to carry out due diligence requirements involving the services of a qualified valuer, a building and pest inspector and a forensic accountant, on top of our own meticulous enquiries.

The results showed a substantial investment opportunity with a return well in excess of anything we can earn from the banks on cash, and as a result, we moved forward with the purchase of both properties during January.

Mackay is equidistant from Townsville and Gladstone, as well as halfway between Brisbane and Cairns. Additional business confidence in the region is growing based on a population of 125,000, and the added benefit of a massive future of mining in the area.

Staff interviews determined the family influence in the coal industry, along with other mining interests in the multiple mines in the Galilee, Bowen and Fitzroy River Basins surrounding Mackay. The commencement of further new mines will assist in providing a solid basis for investment growth.

Motel occupancy rates are currently around 70% and growing. It is anticipated these two motels will run off each other from a management perspective and provide members with a very good diversified revenue proposition with a solid combined nett income based on 2017 figures.

Many commercial properties in our local area were considered, however purchase prices were deemed excessive based on returns, which were nowhere near the returns anticipated for a lesser outlay for the Galaxy Motor Inn (20 rooms) and Shakespeare Motel (36 rooms, 32 in use) in Mackay.

Your Board believes that earning bank interest of 2.5% is not the best use of members' money. Based on best business practice and remembering the reasons explained previously for the need for diversity, opportunities outside gaming are a good investment strategy.

Why not spend money on the Club? Over the last 10 years, the Board has invested \$110 million to improve facilities for members, not including everyday members' benefits. Many capital developments are also under discussion, requiring development approval for the long-term future benefit of Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts.

Due to changes in the market, and liquor and gaming preferences, to invest more in the traditional business model is far less certain than in the past.

We continue to work on Club Banora's and Juniors' futures but while our strategic planning is ongoing, achieving development approvals is challenging and unfortunately takes time.

It is frustrating to us that opportunities outside the Tweed are so achievable in normal commercial timeframes, and as fast as our world is moving, we think it is prudent to act sooner rather than later.

Directors will recommend to members at our May Annual General Meeting that the Galaxy Motor Inn and Shakespeare

Motel should each be declared 'Non-Core' in accordance with the Registered Clubs Act to allow possible leasing or perhaps sale at any future date.

Members have previously supported Directors' recommendations for areas to be 'Non-Core' to allow future leasing or sale of property where they are not part of the main premises operations.

And of course, members travelling through Mackay will also benefit with a 10% reduction in accommodation rates and be welcomed with typical Twin Towns hospitality. Links to our website will be added after settlement.

### Christmas Cheer and Member Benefit points' redemption

In December 2018, for the first time, members were offered the opportunity to transfer the Members Advantage points they had accumulated during the year to Twin Towns and Pitstop Gift Cards.

Many members made the most of this new option prior to the close of business on Christmas Eve, redeeming \$70,860 in gift cards which they could use for purchases at a later date.

Members' birthday \$10 bonus gifts for 2018 totalled \$93,600.

Members Christmas Cheer \$10 bonus gift spend over the two days prior to Christmas totalled \$21,202 at all three Clubs.

Last but not least, members spent \$647,000 worth of members' benefit points in 2018 with \$191,500 worth of points spent in December alone.

By utilising Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts, everyone is a winner. Thank you for your support, good health and I look forward to catching up around our Clubs and Resorts.

# Twin Towns Snooker Club

Twin Towns Snooker Club operates with three billiard tables out of Club Banora. The Club is very active and presents a wide range of championship and social events annually to provide competitive snooker to members.

The Club conducts the following Championships: A, B & C Grade Scratch Snooker Championships; A, B & C Grade Handicap Snooker Championships; Billiards Scratch Championships – one grade; Billiards Handicap Championships – one grade; Handicap Doubles Championship – run on a single day; Club Handicap Championship – all in.

These events are programmed progressively during the year and are spaced over several months with each succeeding round to be played by a due date, unless a one day event.

A Teams Handicap Competition is conducted on Wednesday evenings in Autumn and Spring which comprises teams of three.

This popular event involves singles matches and one doubles pairing on each night over the competition rounds; finals then played out.

Sunday sponsored tournaments are conducted approximately 14 Sundays per year. Good prizemoney is available and you will need to be on your game.

Our flagship event for the year is the Eamonn Duff Open Handicap Snooker tournament over the October long weekend. Prize money is approximately \$4,000 and attracts upwards of 50 players; a very strong competition.

The Club runs social handicap snooker Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Nominate by 6pm NSW. The events involve a main competition and first round loser's competition. Cash prizes for the winners and runners-up. Cost is \$6 for Snooker Club members and \$7 for visitors.

In between the Teams competitions, the Club conducts

a tournament on Wednesday evenings with the maximum start to be given limited to 20 and caters for the lower handicapped players. However, all are welcome to play and the cost is members \$6, visitors \$7; 2 frames minimum per evening.

The Snooker Club is an affiliate of the Far North Coast Snooker Association which conducts Scratch and Handicap regional snooker championships, teams and doubles events and a billiards championship. All our members are eligible to contest these championships.



# Reducing Costs and Safe Driving for Seniors



On Monday 18 March at 11am Qld, Service NSW will host two consecutive free presentations in the Bay Room, level 3 at Twin Towns, where seniors living in NSW can learn important and useful information about reducing their living costs, as well as requirements for older driver licensing.

Many NSW seniors are unaware of the savings they can access to help cut household costs, including energy, gas, water and low-income rebates, appliance replacement schemes and energy blackout compensation.

The presentation is an opportunity to learn about eligibility for rebates how the application process works.

The second part of the presentation includes information about the older driver licensing system in NSW, licensing options, the practical driving assessment and medical examination required once drivers reach 75 years of age.

The older driver licensing system is designed to balance the safety of road users and the general community with the continuing independence and mobility of older drivers.

The presentations will take place immediately after the Seniors Social Club meeting. Registration is not required. Just come along and be seated in the Bay Room prior to commencement of the presentations at 11am Qld.
