He regularly attends RSL Welfare visits to John Flynn Hospital, fundraises for the Cancer Society and visits local primary schools.

Les Taylor has served over 60 years of RSL membership, including Executive stints at the Gold

### Edward Felix Tardent

One of the faces you'll see is Edward (Ted) Tardent, a young Corporal from Roma Queensland who enlisted at the age of 16 years by falsifying his records to say he was 18.

Ted ultimately paid the supreme sacrifice at the age of just 18, when he was killed in action in Belgium



on 31 July 1917. Just over a week prior on 23 July, he penned his last letter to his parents. Here is an excerpt:

*I take this opportunity to write you what may be my last loving words. We are being launched into a large offensive, and if I do not*

*happen to pull through, a pal of mine shall send you this letter. Should I not survive, I shall die knowing that I have done my duty, both to my King and country. Mind you, I am not a bit afraid to die, for I have faced death too many times to be afraid of it. The Tardents are made of good, solid stuff, and I can live or die just as the bravest of the bravest. I am in extremely good health and, thanks to you, my dear parents, have always been the same. Now, goodbye, loved ones, and remember, should I die, I died bravely.*

## BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

### BOARD OF MANAGEMENT REPORT 2018

On behalf of Directors of Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts, I present this financial and principal activities report of the Company for the year ending 31 December 2018, for what has been one of the most challenging trading years experienced.

The Commonwealth Games, although a magnificent sporting spectacle, unfortunately set the tone for a trading downturn that realistically didn't recover fully for the balance of 2018.

Our core business of gaming saw a net revenue downturn for the year of \$1.4 million which reflected across the business generally.

Considerations for such a flat year seem to favour a general lack of confidence in the economy, a fuel cost blowout, electricity and general cost of living increases, stock market volatility and fear of an unknown future, with similar trading outcomes extending across the industry in NSW.

To be risk averse and do nothing is not the answer, however, concentrating on results-driven operations with good governance and diligence to minimise risk will achieve good results.

The eight ASX principles for good governance and best practice to benefit members for the short and long-term future objectives of this great Club were foremost in Directors' thinking at the Board and Management annual strategic planning weekend in July, which delivered positive outcomes.

A strategy for determining positive objectives evolved from this planning weekend, with determinations to progress: rectification of catering; commencement of Twin Towns Mantra/Accor hotel refurbishment; recommence Club Banora commercial development including conducting feasibility for Aged Care; revisit Twin Towns Juniors proposed development with a justification analysis; progress the Cobaki greenfield club and childcare development proposal; and continue the evolution of digital commerce.

An overall marketing and entertainment analysis with a view

to increasing profitability was adopted as recommended.

The divestment of a Flame Bistro, including 1st on Wharf, to existing successful contract caterers at Slice & Fork at Club Banora, Wok Chop & Grill at Juniors and Orient at Twin Towns, took place on 4 December. The move was a simple transition which exceeded expectations and supported all staff and contractors alike. Unfortunately, the Club Industry Award doesn't afford the flexibility of contract caterers and although Directors put off change for years, the inevitable opportunity became a necessity.

To minimise power increases, the evolutionary transition to solar was considered viable as part of the diversification strategies discussed at our strategic planning weekend. Based on return on investment and environmental sustainability, a 53kw solar roof structure above the Flame dining area will be installed by local company, SAE. The system uses the latest technology, including 134 x sun power 395w panels and Fronius Inverters, which will reduce the Club's carbon footprint and energy bills by approximately \$14,000 per annum.

Work on the Twin Towns Mantra/Accor Resort has continued around the entry foyer, garden and pool areas. Major works on the Lobby level reception area, hallway and Signatures bar and restaurant entrance is now underway.

This will be followed by the refurbishment of the upper levels of hotel rooms, encompassing one floor each year. This will continue until all 116 units across five floors are completed at a cost of just under \$10 million dollars.

When considering the uncertainty of the core business of gaming, the Board determined to continue the diversity options of suitable land banking and property investment to benefit members.

On reflection, while analysing the previous ten years, the Board had approved outlays of \$110 million improving, refurbishing and supporting members' facilities, mostly from cash flow.

Consequently, interest-bearing bank deposits averaging 2.7% p.a.

over the recent term was viewed as unsatisfactory business practice, while building investment assets with good returns and growth potential on behalf of members to support gaming irregularities for the long-term, was far more prudent.

Opportunities for land banking with potential to develop a diversified income stream from Recreation and Boyd Streets land continue to be explored with two motel properties purchased and settled in early 2019 with anticipated returns well above bank interest.

When considering the many diversification options, the Board is well aware of their social responsibilities, environmental sustainability principles, club values and especially member and community expectations.

The Board adopts good governance and best practice principles, while advocating accountability and transparency in decision-making.

When the business revenue exceeds \$71 million, Director training is imperative. Many Directors undertake mandatory continual professional development training to maintain personal qualifications, while others attend the Australian Institute of Company Directors training, ClubsNSW professional development courses, Zone Meetings and Conferences.

Professional qualifications and mandatory education for future directors with appropriate skill sets are more in demand than ever before. Directors' responsibilities have profound importance, remembering Director liability is up for question on every decision.

Corporate Australia is recommending Boards adopt gender equality by having a minimum 30% female participation and Twin Towns is certainly aware of the need to have a greater representation of women when female members equate to 47% of our membership overall.

It is expected the Board will nominate highly qualified women with a positive understanding of the industry, including appropriate skill sets, to fill casual vacancies in the foreseeable future.

Despite the need for gender diversity at Twin Towns, it is imperative to appoint the best possible candidates for our not-for-profit community club when overseeing the strategic management of member assets.

Performance measurement is monitored by integrated data technology combining point of sale (POS) systems, gaming technology and booking systems by our Operations Team, overseen by Directors. It requires robust decision-making to rectify

changes in business activity and minimise any risk while growing the business.

The digital revolution continues unabated, allowing business decisions to be financially prudent based on data collection. This results in reduced costs and simplicity of operation, while empowering members to take some ownership with a much greater practical understanding and commitment to ensure our future.

In 2018, membership totalled 41,102, while our total company assets were recorded to be \$176 million. Group turnover was \$71 million, with total net profit before tax totalling \$242K. Cash profit was recorded at \$8.32 million, generated by adding net profit before tax to depreciation of \$8.08 million.

It is imperative that compliance in work place health and safety for 313 staff and all stakeholders continues to be monitored, as well as understanding and maintaining the multitude of corporate Acts and regulations applicable to the club industry.

Staff loyalty acquired over time is second to none, with many serving between 10 and 30 years – truly an amazing record admired by our peers in the industry.

Staff training, our awards programme, overall recognition and service above self for members is well recognised.

As a community club, our support for Junior Sport and charitable organisations continues through ClubGRANTS and general donations with \$991K grants provided to community.

The Twin Towns Services Community Foundation supported Medical Research and other charitable groups with funding of \$221K and a one-off joint effort from both Twin Towns and The Foundation supporting NSW drought relief with a combined donation of \$40K.

Directors are especially mindful of their community corporate social responsibility while encouraging local contractor engagement for product and services.

Twin Towns takes a determined stance on responsible service of alcohol and conduct of gaming, assisted by the Salvation Army Chaplaincy service under the watchful eye of Marty Thompson.

Twin Towns was especially proactive in promoting a successful seminar during Gambling Awareness Week involving ClubsNSW, The Buttery (gambling, drug and alcohol rehabilitation), The Salvation Army Chaplaincy with Marty Thompson, supported by Peter Rudland, an ADF Ex-Ser-

vice veteran, and the local Police. One cannot underestimate the magnificent work Twin Towns RSL Sub-Branch continues to commit to supporting the welfare of Ex-Service personnel and the community.

Their work ethic and organisational prowess in putting together ANZAC Day Services, the 100th year anniversary of Armistice Day (Remembrance Day), the support and services they provide for Ex-Service group reunions, member funeral services, and generally taking care of their own, deserves much greater recognition.

Twin Towns is privileged to provide financial support of \$170K to support their exceptional work.

World-class sporting facilities at Club Banora including golf, tennis, bowls and the Oasis Pools Complex, provide members and community with outstanding facilities.

Our commitment to ongoing maintenance and capital support for these member and community facilities in 2018 amounted to \$441K being spent, an essential part of the not-for-profit community club fabric.

Twin Towns 15 Internal Club committees, made up of over 100 passionate volunteers, conduct sporting and social activities to entertain multitudes of members of all ages, establishing comradery with a family orientation, making Twin Towns 'MY Club'.

The Board recognises the invaluable contribution our dedicated volunteer members make to organise, manage and build membership of these social and sporting clubs.

Twin Towns is extremely fortunate to have an Executive Management team of highly qualified personnel. They are dedicated and passionate about the industry in their specific field of expertise, forming a team to advance Twin Towns as a most modern, efficient and well-structured operation.

Leading by example, CEO Rob Smith encourages his team to think laterally to achieve the best outcomes for all stakeholders.

Profound recommendations put forward, and exemplary outcomes achieved after a most timely 2018 Strategic Planning Meeting in July, have certainly paved the way for a far more productive future. After a most challenging year, these revenue benefits will flow into 2019.

I thank Rob on behalf of all concerned for his dedication and leadership.

Directors have a positive view for the future of Twin Towns, with strategies for future growth to mitigate risk and secure this great Club for future generations.

Planning objectives and accountability are constructed for transparency to achieve member, community and stakeholder support to achieve our goals.

## Man up and head to the mherv

Rotary Club of Banora-Tweed invite all local men to visit the mherv, (Men's Health Educational Rural Van), when it pays a visit to Club Banora on Saturday 13 April and Sunday 14 April (10pm to 4pm).

If you haven't had time for a check-up lately, a few simple tests could alert you to health problems you're not aware of.

Peter Wallace-Harrison from the Rotary Club of Banora-Tweed said that between August and December 2018, almost 1,000 men living in rural NSW were given free, five-minute routine checks at the mherv.

"Sixteen of these men were found to be at serious risk and told to seek medical attention urgently. Another 300 or so were advised to visit their GP for further assessment.

"There have been times when nurses have discovered a person's blood pressure has been 'through the roof' and were at immediate risk of a heart attack. They've closed the van and taken that person straight to the nearest hospital," said Peter.

There's plenty of evidence that many men get so tied up in their busy day-to-day lives juggling work, business and family, they simply don't make time to keep their health in check.

The mherv tests involve blood pressure, to check the heart isn't stressed; body mass or BMI to check height, weight and girth; blood sugar levels to check for diabetes – just a pin prick; and cholesterol, another pin prick test to see if levels are high and need attention.

Peter said that women too should get behind the project and give the men in their lives "a shove in the right direction".

"Drag them along if you have to. Just remind them that five minutes out of their life could potentially save their life," said Peter.

Twin Towns is pleased to support Rotary Club of Banora-Tweed on their initiative and hope to see a line-up of locals, and staff, joining them in the queue when the van comes to Club Banora.


