Beachy new look at Mantra Twin Towns

Stage 1 of refurbishments at the Mantra Twin Towns foyer are complete, with remodelling and brand-new interior design creating a contemporary, beach-themed space.

The new design introduces a refreshing, bright and breezy coastal colour palette, with lots of whites, complemented by natural timbers and textures.

A new reception counter and carpet throughout has been installed and the revamp of Signatures Lobby Bar has created a larger, more

welcoming space for early evening drinks and cocktails.

An air lock has also been created at the front door of the resort to protect the Lobby from wind and weather and optimise comfort for guests.

The first stage of the refurbishment of Mantra Twin Towns hotel rooms will commence in late July with 24 hotel rooms and hallways on Levels 4 and 5 the first to undergo a transformation.

The rooms will have new carpet and curtains, light

fittings, mirror slider to wardrobes, TV wall panels, stone benchtops and new cabinetry in kitchenettes, showers replaced and contemporary, built-in bed heads and side tables.

The refurbishment will introduce a coastal vibe to the rooms, with colours that complement the resort's location, just minutes to the golden sands and sparkling waves of Coolangatta and Greenmount beaches.

It is expected the rooms will be completed by September 2019.

Twin Towns helps out in Townsville

Whilst the monsoon season may be behind North Queenslanders for another year, many Townsville residents continue to count the costs of the catastrophic floods in February.

At the time, a call went out from Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk for fellow Queenslanders to dig deep to support the flood appeals and help out their northern neighbours.

Although just a few metres shy of the Queensland border, it didn't stop Twin Towns from chipping in \$25,000 on behalf of members, especially its 17,500 or so Queensland members.

The donation was made to The Salvation Army Flood Appeal by the Twin Towns Community Foundation, the Club's philanthropic association set up to

provide financial and in-kind assistance to local community groups and causes.

At times, the Foundation's financial assistance extends outside the State, such as donations to drought appeals, funding of medical research, university scholarships and international aid appeals.

The donation from the Foundation will be specifically allocated towards assisting flood-affected members of the Townsville community.

Some months on from the floods, The Salvation Army continues to deploy around 16 staff a day into Townsville to work within five recovery hubs and outreach teams.

Twin Towns Board Director and Secretary of the

Twin Towns Community Foundation, Dr John Griffin said the work of The Salvation Army in North Queensland is ongoing.

"There is no clear indication yet of a conclusion date and already The Salvation Army has assisted over 2,000 families and provided over \$1M in financial assistance to flood-affected people and families.

"We hope this donation from Twin Towns will help ease some of the burden the floods have caused to the people of Townsville, as they get on with rebuilding their lives, and their livelihoods, in the wake of this natural disaster," said Dr Griffin.

Derek Brown, Philanthropy Team Leader (QLD, NSW & ACT), Communications and Fundraising Depart-

ment at the Salvation Army, said Twin Towns Services Community Foundation has supported The Salvation Army Emergency Services through every major natural disaster since the Victorian Bushfires in 2013 to the current floods in Townsville in February 2019.

"The Foundation's generous financial support, totalling \$375,000 during these seven years, has given thousands of Australians hope where it's needed most in the midst of some of our biggest natural disasters," said Derek.

Diversity

April Club News depicted the Directors Annual Report (unaudited) for 2018 which makes up the Annual Report of Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts. The report is available to members by request through the Club Secretary and is published in the members only area of the website www.twintowns.com.au. The year that was is possibly one of the toughest to date, however, decisions made by Directors at the July 2018 Strategic Planning Meeting have certainly made a difference, with an increased revenue stream, and placed the Club in a strong position going forward.

The general economy driving up cost of living increases to members and community, added to political uncertainty, has resulted in a lack of confidence in the future. This has caused less disposable income and discretionary spending, not only in our local government area but right across the State and beyond.

I emphasise cashflow is still strong, and we expect this to grow but tough decisions made in the past eight months will continue into the future to ensure the best possible outcome for Twin Towns and all concerned.

Not all decisions made by Directors have been well received but the Board and Management's concern,

first and foremost, is for the long-term future of this great Club.

The 'Not for Profit Community Club' model that built Twin Towns for the past 60 years to be the successful Club it is today cannot be relied upon to take the Club forward in the future.

Last year our core business of gaming was down almost \$1.4 million, which equates to a major change in dynamics causing a rethink for diversity and strategic planning.

Past practices used to identify when economies of scale get tough, patrons spend more on gaming and alcohol, may have worked once but this is certainly not the case in this instance.

Surprisingly, our operational analytics show support from members and patrons entering our Clubs continues unabated, however, that discretionary spend on gaming has diminished considerably.

Gaming continues to be under threat with The Greens, Get Up and many other recalcitrant individuals and groups who continue to push for the abolition of gambling through one means or another.

The fact that gaming is a form of social recreation for most, with patrons being responsible for their actions, is incidental with pressure on Clubs, manufacturers and politicians continuing unabated to eliminate Clubs' core business. Doesn't take an Einstein to estab-

lish the ramifications of minimising one's core business.

Twin Towns' strategic plan continues to strive for diversity to build that additional revenue stream to be less reliant on gaming (53% of gaming revenue to total revenue).

Our Events space on Level 3, Mantra/Accor Resort, 1st on Wharf Hotel, Recreation and Boyd Street acquisitions for land banking, and the newly acquired Mackay properties, portray this resolve.

The future direction of the Board at present is to support a Development Application for a Child Care Centre on two of the Recreation Street properties, incorporating the storage warehouse, for a lease between Twin Towns and a reputable and award-winning local Child Care Company. It is intended to be in operation by 2020 and this additional revenue will benefit our diversity strategy.

The Club Banora strategic plan that commenced in 2008 is back on the agenda as a matter of high importance.

Back in 2008, Club Banora was losing \$800K per annum, which of course was unsustainable. The Board chose to engage accountancy firm KPMG and Footprint Market Research to undertake a full analysis of what was needed to turn this fabulous, world-class members sporting facility around.

The result was four full member presentations by KPMG and Footprint Market Research over a twelve-month period. At these presentations, it was explained why Level 2 was a liability, including the plan required to redevelop and refurbish the existing Club on the ground floor with a full analysis of costs and anticipated returns.

Added to the actual Club refurbishment was a proposal for a completely new Masterplan, en-

compassing a commercial development between Leisure Drive and the existing Club (3.4 hectares of retail, leaving an overall balance of 56.7 hectares). This would create a diversified revenue stream for future generations.

Members, sporting groups, internal clubs and community were all consulted to gather their perceived views on their future needs. It's important to note that sporting facilities affected by this proposal are to be reinstated in close proximity to the Club in accordance with the Masterplan, although perhaps on a smaller scale.

Following this series of presentations at the next Annual General Meeting in 2009, members approved the strategic plan to futureproof Banora with unanimous support.

The Board, through Darryl Anderson Consulting and a cacophony of expert consultants, undertook to seek Development Approval for a change of zoning of part Lot 2 1040576 Leisure Drive zoned as 6(b) to 3(b) General Business under the Tweed LEP 2000.

This approval was granted in 2015 at a cost of \$650,000, with an additional \$250,000 to be paid for the Leisure Drive roundabout widening on final Commercial Development Approval.

At considerable cost, and following many meetings with all stakeholders, not to mention representatives from Tweed Shire Council, neither a compromise nor a resolution was within reach for the much-needed commercial development application. With the increased cost blow-out, the Board chose to temporarily put plans on hold.

In 2018, the direction the industry seemed to be taking caused the Board to again re-evaluate the commercial development need at our July strategy meeting, with the resultant risk to the company

outweighing any shelving of plans to develop this additional revenue stream too great to ignore.

Consultants and management have been working overtime to prepare a Development Application to allow two national retail tenants to acquire leasehold premises to support Club Banora, members, community, all stakeholders and much-needed local employment for the future.

The Board is committed to achieving a result at all costs with plans due to be submitted to Council shortly.

In late 2018, the Club was approached by a reputable national nursing home group to lease a parcel of land for a nursing home at Club Banora.

This parcel of land was originally designated as Retirement Village/ Nursing Home on Banora's Master Plan.

It's important to remember the total area of Banora is 60.1 hectares, and the area required is approximately 1.5 hectares, encompassing part of the practice fairway.

I emphasise this does not interfere with the members and community golf course. Discussions are ongoing but one must take into consideration the value of a long-term additional diversified income stream to future proof member assets.

Twin Towns Masterplan to establish a satellite club and childcare centre on Greenfield space at Cobaki is ongoing as part of our strategic diversity plan.

The Board continues to examine opportunities to diversify and develop long-term projects to meet the many challenges the industry faces.

Good health and I look forward to catching up around our Clubs and Resort.

Association of Veteran Surfers

The Association of Veteran Surfers (AVS) is a Surfing Queensland affiliated, volunteer-based board riders club, started in 2016 by Vets, for Vets. The aim was to connect the Veteran community through surfing.

Founders Matthew Hoare and Kieran Scotchford shared similar experiences and stresses whilst serving together in the 8/9th Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment. They knew first-hand the difficulties faced by Veterans transitioning to a civilian life.

Military life offers many challenges, physically and mentally. Every day is different, from physical training to live fire exercises. With each challenge comes responsibility for yourself and your mates.

Matthew and Kieran said that upon discharge from a career full of purpose, the soldier is propelled into civilian life and that

feeling disappears in an instant.

"Most Vets struggle to find a career that matches the defence force, become isolated, and struggle to find get back on track.

"Surfing can offer all the same challenges, and a healthy and fun way to relieve these stresses.

"AVS surfers discover the physical and mental challenges are similar. The ocean can be a dangerous place if not respected, while you're out against the odds from big waves to dangerous marine life.

"Suddenly, the Vet is back in an environment where he or she is not only looking out for themselves, but their mates to the left and right," they said.

AVS is an opportunity to participate in a group activity without the need for alcohol, and anxiety and pressure of crowds quickly disappear once the surfers hit the water.

No matter what service you were in, how long or short your career, how many deployments you did, whether you're an experienced surfer or a beginner, there is a place for you at AVS.

AVS currently has a partnership with RSL Queensland, delivering the RSL QLD Surfing Initiative family days on the Gold Coast.

The event is held on the third Sunday of the month, with activities including surfing lessons, BBQ breakfast, surfing competitions and free surf sessions.

Anyone that is still serving, a Veteran, or is part of the Veteran community, is welcome to enjoy the activities on offer.

Twin Towns helps out Junior sailors

Local schools, surf clubs, junior sports clubs, palliative and aged care centres, programs for people with disabilities and youth centres, are just a few of the valuable community organisations that share around \$1M in financial and in-kind support from Twin Towns each year, through the ClubGRANTS scheme.

Recent recipient of funding through ClubGRANTS was the Tweed Valley Sailing Club's junior program.

Last month, they received a handy boost of \$2,500 through ClubGRANTS, which enabled them to purchase an aluminium trailer, which came with four new boats.

Club Commodore Bill Fenelon said the Junior Sailing Club offers a low-cost sail training program for kids from its base at Fingal.

"Over the years, the junior club has grown, with around 40 kids in attendance each weekend."

Bill said the grant will have a huge impact on the future of the junior club and their attendance at regattas at other locations.

"We often travel to regattas on the Clarence River, where up to 100 juniors from all over the region attend weekend sailing camps.

"With our new trailer, we will be able to take up to eight boats," said Bill.

Flame's Stromboli is made from pizza dough, filled with mozzarella cheese, pepperoni, ham, herbs and roasted capsicum.

Unlike a Calzone, which is a bit like a crescent-shaped folded pizza, Stromboli is rolled into a cylinder. Then, it's placed in the piping hot pizza oven until it's golden brown and oozing with gooey cheesy perfection. Flame's Stromboli is served with garlic aioli on the side.

Executive Chef Lloyd Cremer has added his own unique twist to a family favourite with Oven-baked Mac and Cheesecake.

Quesadillas originated in Mexico, and the name is derived from tortilla (the flatbread) and the Spanish word for cheese, 'queso'. In Spanish, quesadilla means 'little cheesy thing'.

Flame's quesadilla come in a choice of Tex Mex chicken or Mexican spiced beef, with capsicum, red onions, mozzarella with sour cream, salsa and avocado. The filling is loaded into the tortilla, folded, toasted and cut into triangles to serve.

Perfect for after-the-show lunch or a snack any time of the day, quesadillas are just \$12.50 members; and \$13.50 visitors.



From Blue Lagoon to Ladies Night

One-time heart-throb Christopher Atkins, from the 1980 hit movie, Blue Lagoon, is coming to Twin Towns to star in the hilarious play, Ladies Night, alongside Steven Tandy (The Sullivans) and Alli Pope, (Menopause The Musical).

Ladies Night tells the story of a bunch of unemployed, middle-aged blokes who, motivated by The Chippendales, decide to form a male strip act to make some fast bucks.

They take lessons from a slightly shop-worn dance instructor with a heart-of-gold in all manner of things, including what women really want from a male stripper, and how to deliver it.

Written by Anthony McCarten and Stephen Sinclair, Ladies Night has been translated into twelve languages and remains New Zealand's most commercially successful play, of all time.



In case you're wondering, Christopher Atkins was born in New York on 21 February 1961 and was just 18 years

of age when he starred alongside Brooke Shields in his debut role in Blue Lagoon.

He went on to star in The Pirate Movie (1982), A Night in Heaven (1983), had recurring roles in Dallas (1983-84) and appeared in many more movies in the 1990s and 2000s.

During a recent interview, Christopher said it was flattering to be in a movie that is recognisable to this day.
