BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

By way of explanation, as a practising grey nomad, I have been touring much of the drought-stricken areas of Western Queensland for most of August and September, absorbing an education on issues west of the divide. This made it extremely difficult to write the monthly Club News articles for members and I thank those who made enquiries on the missing link.

Club Banora

Gaming is undoubtedly the core business of clubs, without which most clubs with their world class community facilities providing local community support would cease to exist.

Despite clubs being proactive delivering numerous forms of protection for pokie players through responsible conduct of gaming protocols, clubs are continually singled out by some political parties, politicians and individuals who remonstrate against clubs and gaming to advance their individual standing.

I don't intend to labour the point on the anti-club lobby, nor on perceived addiction issues even when social players who enjoy a flutter should assume some responsibility for their actions. I'm going to focus on the future of the not-for-profit-community club industry and the need for clubs, in this case, Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts, to diversify to ensure the long-term future for the next generation of community club members.

The Diversity Evolution (following October Club News)

Twin Towns Directors and our Management team understand that the 60 year old club model is changing and continues to change

rapidly with the need to quickly look outside the square for a new direction becoming blatantly clear.

Remembering, in 2009 Club Banora was struggling to attract members and therefore revenue, placing a question mark on Banora's ability to continue as a viable entity at that time.

KPMG (accounting firm) were called in to complete a feasibility study and present their findings to members, which involved studies from a range of consultants, market research and most importantly, the views of internal sporting clubs and local members based on their recommendations going forward armed with the facts.

The AGM called on 19 May 2009 to progress findings was a watershed moment.

The participation of members who wished to receive the findings of KPMG's review presented at Banora in 2008/9 was terrific with over 300 members attending each of the four resulting presentations.

Results concluded the club model had to change. This led to our current club configuration which has been very successful, as well as a future plan to create a totally new footprint as part of our strategic plan, to include a commercial component and seniors living with a diversified income stream to ensure the long-term future of this great Club.

To achieve full member support on the proposed recommendations, the separation of an area of three hectares, made up of the bowls greens and land to the eastern boundary, for the purpose of declaring this section 'non-core' was needed, thus allowing the Board to make commercial

decisions over this area.

In accordance with the Registered Clubs Act on behalf of members, the 2009 AGM was called, including a presentation to allow members to vote to determine their resolve on the future strategy.

Members were unanimous with their verdict to proceed with major structural changes and full refurbishment of the existing Club and to allow three hectares to be 'non-core' for future commercial development as part of the new diversity footprint.

Some closures, reconstruction and refurbishment of the existing Club that took place in 2010 had an immediate effect on profitability, showing a turnaround of approximately \$2 million, which was beyond expectations.

At the same time, plans were drawn up and submitted to Council to change the existing zoning of the area determined as 'non-core', Lot 2 in DP 1040576, an area of three hectares of Banora land of the overall 57.1 hectares which comprises Club Banora, from RE2 Recreation to B2 Local Centre, to allow the commercial development planning process to proceed. This rezoning Development Application was approved on 15 September 2015.

Challenges

Over the years, the club industry has faced many challenges from the Labor State Government tax grab to a political division, forcing the Federal Labor government to plan to intervene in State policy and attempt to force clubs to adopt mandatory pre-commitment. This may well have seen the demise of the not-for-profit community club industry.

Fortunately, after a huge campaign from the club in-

dustry, the then Labor government eventually withdrew their proposal.

The Gold Coast Casino, Queensland poker machines and hotel poker machines increased regulation all took a toll eroding the club model.

The general growth of coastal areas, extensive distribution of liquor licenses, the drought, cost of living and tough economic conditions due to national and international uncertainty overall, have certainly caused many changes to Twin Towns' business model, resulting in a proactive response.

Most significantly, people's tastes are changing, as is their attitude to gambling and alcohol.

Over the past few years, gaming revenue, the core business of clubs, has diminished across the State with a specific decline in nett revenue at Twin Towns in the vicinity of 11%.

A turnaround may be forthcoming but planning for a diversified revenue stream is imperative for the future protection of member and community assets.

Examples of the Board's strategic diversification plan are the Resort Hotel, Level 3 event space, the Mackay Motel properties, Recreation Street Childcare Centre due to open in 2020, Cobaki future club and childcare, land banking for future growth, the proposed Club Banora commercial development and possible future development of the under-utilised practice fairway on excess land.

Member presentation and EGM

As a not-for-profit community club, members' world-class facilities are maintained by the Board as a community asset, including Club Banora, which is vital to the Twin Towns group.

The golf course is part of that entity that continues to be well maintained by professional maintenance staff, with the central collapsed section considered beyond repair both physically and especially financially.

The practice fairway consisting of three hectares of the total 57.1 hectares was part of the diversification plan taken to members for acceptance as part of a future development footprint in 2009 and always considered superfluous to sporting needs.

Despite issues based on the flight path, flooding and a potential Aboriginal heritage significance mapping, approaches have been made to the Board to either sell and or lease this 2.3 hectares of land over the years for a number of uses.

The Board believes that the best options for this land should now be explored to add to the Club's diversity and will ask the members to declare this area non-core so that the processes can be advanced.

The Board has two planned presentations for members to be presented with the proposed commercial diversification plans on the rezoned three-hectare non-core portion of Banora

due to go to Council later this year.

Members and the community are invited to attend these sessions on 7 November at 6.15 pm NSW time in the Banora Lounge and 12 November at 6.15 pm Qld in the Twin Towns Showroom.

Members will receive notice of an Extraordinary General Meeting on 12 December at 6pm Qld to request members to allow the practice fairway to be declared 'non-core', therefore allowing the Board to make commercial decisions if and when required for the long-term viability of Banora in the interests of members. We certainly look forward to your attendance and support.

I look forward to catching up around our Clubs and Resorts, on Remembrance Day, at our member presentations and finally the Extraordinary Annual General Meeting at 6pm Qld in the Showroom on 12 December 2019.
