



Brumby wins Ironman World Title

Every long distance triathlete's dream is to compete in the iconic Ironman World Championships in Kona, Hawaii and for ex-serviceman Matt Brumby, that dream came true. And against all odds, he won!

Matt joined the Royal Australian Navy in 1994 at the age of 16. In 2000, while undertaking selection to be a Navy clearance diver he collapsed on the beach.

Soon after, Matty was diagnosed with a syrinx, a fluid filled cavity in his spinal cord that had paralysed him from just below the chest down.

Undeterred, Matt's diagnosis opened up new opportunities. He worked on a farm, learned to operate excavators and tractors and even trained to be a pilot.

Within a few years he competed in his first triathlon, narrowly missing out on selection for the Paralympics in Rio, before switching to long distance triathlons.

Following a successful Sydney Invictus Games 2018 as co-captain, Matt qualified for the Ironman World Championships, despite there being only four handcyclo-

spots available worldwide. The gruelling format for the Ironman race is a 3.8km swim, 180km handcycycle through the city of Kona and out into the lava fields, returning to the city centre on a racing wheelchair for 42.2km.

So began four months of meticulous training around Terranora and Murwillumbah with Invictus Games co-captain and great mate, Peter Rudland.

Peter, a Tweed Heads & Coolangatta RSL Sub-Branch member, was badly wounded in a Blackhawk Helicopter crash in Afghanistan in 2010. Matt said that without Twin Towns Services Community Foundation's generous financial assistance package, he would have struggled to get to the starting line in Hawaii.

Twin Towns Services Community Foundation, along with help from Veteran Sports Australia, Legacy WA, a Go Fund me page set up by Peter, made it all possible.

"There was a lot of gear to transport, as well as personal items I needed for the race, and it was beyond my financial capabilities.

"Personally, for me to be able

to compete at the Ironman World Championships was just an amazing chance to test myself and such an amazing experience," said Matt. "No athlete wins a world title without help from a fantastic support network."

"Twin Towns sponsorship has directly attributed to the development of a world class athlete and an

Australian that can now call himself a World Champion. "It is a credit to Twin Towns and its members for their direct community involvement and continued support of the veteran community."

"Without this support, Matty simply would not have been able to compete on a world stage," said Peter.



New Year's Eve 2020

In recognition of the many Queenslanders and New South Wales residents battling catastrophic bushfires, the Twin Towns Board of Management voted to cancel the NYE fireworks at Jack Evans Boat Harbour and Club Banora.

The Board's decision took into consideration the dangers posed by fireworks to bush and grassland in the vicinity of the Clubs, as well as their responsibility to ensure life and property are not placed at risk.

Chairman Michael Fraser said the Board believes "It just feels like the right thing to do."

"Bringing in the New Year without the bang will be a sentiment welcomed by many."

"Watching the devastation across the country, and so close to home, made us reflect on how else we could recognise New Year's Eve this year."

"Lending a helping hand to victims of

this tragedy is firmly on the Board's agenda for 2020 and the \$20,000 allocated for fireworks will instead be donated to bushfire appeals."

Families can still head to the border to see the New Year roll in with presentations on the hour, every hour on the big screen and LEDs on the Twin Towns building.

"It will be like Times Square on the border," said the Chairman.

Michael also sends thoughts and best wishes from everyone at Twin Towns to those affected by the bushfires.

"We commend the rural fires and teams on the ground for their monumental efforts over past weeks. We are hoping for a New Year's reprieve for everyone," he added.

BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

MERRY CHRISTMAS AND A HAPPY, HEALTHY NEW YEAR 2020

To say that 2019 has been an interesting year at Twin Towns would be a gross understatement. However, strategies put in place by the Board for the group should ensure the continued sustainability of our not-for-profit community Club for the next generation of members to experience and enjoy.

On behalf of the Board and Management of Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts, may all members, consultants, stakeholders and especially our terrific staff have a happy, healthy most enjoyable and safe Christmas with family and friends and may 2020 fulfil your every wish for future success.

Environmental Sustainability Management

Environmental sustainability is the rates of renewable resource harvest, pollution creation and non-renewable resource depletion that can be contained indefinitely. If they cannot be continued indefinitely, then they are not sustainable.

The three main pillars of sustainability are economic, environmental and social. Achieving this is often seen

as coming at a cost, which may hamper improvements to quality of life, hence resistance to change.

While I am certain our membership/community takes environmental management at home and at work extremely seriously, the Board and Management of Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts certainly adopt the principal of being proactive, regularly monitoring and assessing our environmental performance.

I recently heard a senior politician say, "Let's not debate the why when it comes to climate change, that argument is old. Let's look at what we can do. We must all take responsibility for our actions and preserve our environment."

The Club Industry, and specifically Twin Towns, is subjected to various environmental regulations under both Commonwealth and State legislation, including the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act with the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 (NSW).

Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts certainly respect the natural environment and its life supporting ecosystems and recognise the adverse

impacts human activity can impose on our environment.

Our implementations of environmental best practice principals in all aspects of our operations are based on a philosophy of 'Rethink, reduce, reuse, repair and recycle'. We have a vexed issue of also needing to respond to customer demands which don't always align, but we do our best.

Twin Towns has a duty of care to the environment, our members and our community and we continue to work on solutions and upgrades that achieve reductions in overall energy, electricity, water, gas, garbage and other utilities usage and to keep costs low.

To protect our environment, we have included adding solar energy and heating ventilation, air conditioning and HVAC changes to deliver efficiencies. These equate to many of the massive hidden costs of running a Community Club business model.

Within the past few years we have developed initiatives to reduce our environmental impact, which include:

- Implementation of high-level electricity monitoring, highlighting usage trends and looking for

opportunities to reduce consumption leading to better supply company tendering options.

- Closer analysis of water consumption to reduce excess usage and leaks. At Club Banora alone, water cost at \$5 per KL (taking into consideration the automated percentage of sewerage and trade waste), equates to \$137,000 for the past 12 months.
- Reduced use of plastics including bin liner removal and implementation of scheduled cleaning.
- Upgrade of all lighting in Ocean Tower carpark to LED tube lighting reducing consumption by 50%.
- Replacing heating ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) at considerable expense and end of life assets with all changes resulting in reduced consumption due to modern technology efficiencies.
- Building management system adjustments to achieve lesser energy demand, maintaining similar comfort levels and results. This is delivered by introducing economy cycles introducing outside air when appropriate over mechanically chilled air.
- Implementation of solar lighting solutions in outdoor areas at Club Banora and Twin Towns Juniors.
- Solar implementation at Twin Towns; 49 KW Solar System = \$54,000. Electricity savings per annum = \$17,870, return on investment = 3 years, expected life up to 25 years = net return of \$762,300.

Twin Towns continues to monitor environmental sustainability issues, maintain best practice Land Care management on the golf course, landscaping and sports turfed areas with WHS compliance covering fuel tanks, chemical usage and storage. Continuation of cleaning and maintaining the moat supporting the western drainage scheme for water quality and usage in conjunction with Council is imperative for golf course maintenance and local environmental efficiencies.

• Twin Towns Mantra Resort is currently undergoing a total refurbishment including lifts which incorporate the latest technology adding to efficiencies, reducing running costs and ultimately protecting the environment.

Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts' strategic focus for sustainability and energy costs remains research, review and implementing initiatives that reduce energy costs with an acceptable return on investment.

We have implemented monitoring for better management of utility costs of electricity, gas and water, and utilise asset regeneration where energy cost returns are of value.

We actively manage the Tri-generation system performance at Club Banora, including better gas pricing to improve returns, and manage change and investment in relation to waste and environmental compliance.

Twin Towns Clubs and Resorts certainly take our environmental best practice management responsibility seriously and understand our long-term sustainability is dependent on us being proactive.

Another year is almost upon us so good health, safe travels and have a great Christmas and I look forward to catching up again around our Clubs and Resorts in 2020.

Meanwhile hope to see you at the Extraordinary General Meeting in the Showroom on 12 December at 6pm Qld.


