



Cycling Without Age

Cycling Without Age has landed on local streets with elderly nursing home residents at Kingscliff and Banora Point among the first to experience the thrill of the wind their hair.

The Danish social enterprise founded in 2012 by Ole Kassow in Copenhagen offers recreational mobility to seniors in the form of volunteer piloted trishaw rides.

CWA boasts 2,050 chapters in 47 countries with 2,700 trishaws, 31,500 trained cycle pilots and more than a million people served.

It lands here courtesy of Bill Van Zetten, a painter, decorator and cycling enthusiast, who signed on to lead a local chapter thinking it would help him ease his own way into retirement.

Bill bought his first regulation electric trishaw with a \$15,000 Salvation Army innovation grant, the application made by his cycling buddy Marty Thompson, Twin Towns Salvation Army Chaplain.

He has approached local nursing homes to offer rides at Kingscliff and Banora Point and hopes eventually to extend

the service to include Tweed Heads and Coolangatta.

Bill launched his service in February, offering half hour rides on his electric trishaw which carries one elderly passenger and a carer per ride.

Chaplain Marty saw a TV documentary about the Danish trikers and thought it was exactly what the region needed to bring community groups together.

"The reaction you get when you're out with the bike is something else. People smile and wave and want to chat," he said.

Having completed his regulation training, Bill is searching for volunteers to train as pilots.

"It's an electric bike so it's not quite as easy as you might think. You need some fitness and there is training and police checks to complete," he said.

Thompson Brothers Automotive at South Tweed supply a trailer to help transport the trishaw.

BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Annual General Meeting

How quickly the years roll by with the 2020 Annual General Meeting of members almost upon us.

All Directors recognise the importance to acknowledge the tremendous support received from members throughout the year, which has certainly contributed to the excellent end of year result under difficult trading conditions. We thank you for your continued support of this great Club.

Directors and Management conduct quarterly meetings to keep our internal club committees fully informed so they can report back to their members.

These meetings cover the financial performance of Twin Towns Clubs and Resort, proposed refurbishments within the group including proposed projects, members' benefits, and direction the Club is taking.

Without a doubt, the most important members meeting of any year is the Annual General Meeting and it is very pleasing to see the large membership base who take

the time and trouble to show their interest and support by attending the AGM.

This year, the Annual General Meeting will take place in the Showroom, Level 5 at Twin Towns Services Club on Tuesday 19 May 2020 at 7pm.

The format for this meeting commences with Apologies, Confirmation of the Minutes of the Extraordinary General Meeting held on Thursday 12 December, Matters Arising, Correspondence Received, Board Report and Financial Report, Election of Directors, to consideration of Ordinary Resolutions to be moved by the Board of Directors. Last but not least, will be General Business. We again look forward to your attendance.

Election of Directors

Nominations are called for election to the position of Director of Twin Towns Services Club Limited with the election to be held at the Annual General Meeting of the Club.

The election will be held to elect three (3) Directors,

each of whom will serve a term of three years in accordance with the Triennial Rule adopted by the Constitution of the Club.

Nominations will open at 9am Qld on 2 March 2020 with nomination packs available from the Executive Office at the Club during office hours.

Nominations will close at 5pm Qld on 17 March 2020 and must be in writing on the prescribed form.

Under the Club's Constitution, nominees are required to be full members of Twin Towns Services Club for a minimum three (3) year period at the date of their nomination (Part 4 - Board and Elections, Rule 20(a) Twin Towns Constitution) as well as undertaking mandatory Director courses covering accounting and governance as prescribed and organised by ClubsNSW. Director's nomination packs contain a copy of the Club's Constitution and explanation of requirements with particular reference to Part 4 for members to be eligible to nominate as Directors.

The two key mandatory governance courses of ClubsNSW to comply with Liquor and Gaming requirements are Director Foundation and Management Collaboration and Finance for Club Boards. Participants receive a certificate of completion confirming their skills and knowledge gained or alternatively qualified nominees applying

for a Directorship may apply to ClubsNSW for an exemption.

Life Membership Recommendation

After receiving a nomination from the Club Banora Golf Club, initiated by the late Ray Tume, Twin Towns Board recommended the meritorious award of Life Membership for Ms Pauline Ryan be put to members for approval at the May AGM for this remarkable lady.

Pauline Ryan was born and raised on a dairy farm in Lismore, later moving to Casino after marriage to work in insurance and raise three children.

Pauline moved to Tweed Heads, finding work at the Tweed Daily News. Her children were educated at Tweed River High, with all three finding work and two graduating from University, but all followed Mum's footsteps serving the community.

The Daily News premises in those days was situated where Mantra Twin Towns now stands in Stuart Street and consequently, Pauline has knowledge of much of this Club's early history.

Joining the Club in 1984 as a Foundation Member of Twin Towns Services Golf Club, Pauline worked on Ladies committees in the '80s and after a break due to illness, returned to the committee in 1990 and was unexpectedly appointed to

Captain in 1992.

During the years spent on committee, the greens were accidentally doused with saltwater when an adjoining protecting bund broke on a neighbouring property. After refurbishment, however, Pauline suggested Banora had the best greens in the district.

Pauline has vivid memories of the course in those early years, along with the problems caused by the salt and the Fig Tree root systems.

During Pauline's stint as Captain, she ran junior tournaments, with Adam Scott the inaugural tournament winner and Jason Day playing Banora as well.

Doing Chook Runs, organising cards and handicapping and sending visitors' cards back to clubs was the weekly norm then.

In 2000, Pauline took on the President's role, however health caused Pauline to take time out after just two years in the job.

When the structure of the Golf Club changed in 2012 to management committees, Pauline became part of the Ladies sub-committee and was part of the group that arranged for the reduced 9 hole course to be played as 18 hole tees.

Pauline had a break again in 2017/18 and returned as Captain later in 2018.

Pauline played golf far and wide, winning the Club

Championship five times and with her old mate, the late Joyce Flanagan, won the foursome championship 13 times.

Fair to say Pauline dedicated much of her life to Banora Golf, always behind the scenes involved in operations, entertainment, decorating rooms and generally involved in all things golf.

For every minute of time given to Banora Golf over the past 35 years, Pauline considers she has been repaid 10-fold, and in times of health issues, has always found solace on this wonderful golf course.

The Twin Towns Board supports Banora Golf Club's nomination for Life Membership for Pauline Ryan, an amazing and humble lady who always puts the club and golf members before herself.

Social Golf turns 50 Years

Back in the '70s, Twin Towns Diggers Golf Club commenced their social competition with Northern Rivers Clubs and continues today as Twin Towns Banora Social Golf Club, competing for an amazing 50 years in March.
