

HARBOUR TERRACE BALCONY EXTENSION HAS ALL MEMBERS COVERED

A Development Application is currently under review by Tweed Shire Council for an extension of the Harbour Terrace balcony and remodelling of the existing outdoor area at the rear of Twin Towns.

The new area will create a picturesque, open space where members can relax outdoors and enjoy one of Twin Towns' most valuable assets – expansive views over Jack Evans Boat Harbour, the Tweed River and beyond.

Once completed, the balcony extension will add an additional 140 square metres of space and allow a non-

smoking area for alfresco dining and drinks.

CEO Rob Smith said the move is in response to many requests the Board has received from non-smoking members who wanted to enjoy a drink and a meal on the balcony.

"We assure our smoking members they won't be overlooked as the new extension will allow half the space to be designated non-smoking, while the other half will continue to be a smoking area.

"The entire balcony will remain a smoking zone outside of meal service hours to

respond to the users of this space during the late evening and into the night.

"We believe the new design will be a win-win for all members and the opportunity to dine or have a drink outdoors with waterfront views will be incredibly popular with everyone who visits the Club."

"Once our DA is approved by Council, it will be all systems go on the new works, which we expect to begin around April 2021," said Rob.

REMEMBRANCE DAY

The tradition of Remembrance Day evolved out of Armistice Day. The initial Armistice Day was observed at Buckingham Palace, commencing with King George V hosting a 'Banquet in Honour of the President of the French Republic' during the evening of 10 November 1919. The first official Armistice Day was subsequently held on the grounds of Buckingham Palace the following morning, 11 November 1919.

During the World War II, many countries changed the name of the day. Member States of the Commonwealth of Nations adopted Remembrance Day, while the USA chose Veterans Day.

A small Remembrance Day ceremony for RSL Sub-Branch committee only will be held on Wednesday 11 November at 11am NSW at the Jack Evans Boat Harbour Memorial. Due to the current restrictions, the usual event cannot be held. (See top right.)


MORE TOP AUSSIE ARTISTS PERFORM IN THE TWIN TOWNS SHOWROOM

Live music is returning to the Twin Towns Showroom with singer songwriter Pete Murray set to headline two COVIDSafe gigs in November.

Murray is touring as part of Great Southern Nights, a NSW government and Destination NSW collaboration designed to kick start the Australian music industry after tough times.

Some 1000 gigs will be performed in regional NSW towns through the November – Australian Music Month – ahead of the ARIA awards.

Local fans will be among the first to hear a live performance of *Found My Place*, Murray's first new single since 2017 and a taste of things to come from two new EPs that are slated for release.

Murray's 2003 roots-rock infused debut album *Feeler* spawned *Beautiful*, the most performed Australian song of the year, sold six times platinum in Australia, earned 12 ARIA award nominations and spent two and half years in the Top 100. His 2005 follow up *See the Sun* featured the hits *Better Days* and *Opportunity*.

Albums *Summer at Eureka*, *Blue Sky Blue*, *The Byron Sessions* and *Camacho* followed.

Murray will be supported at Twin Towns by Matthew Armitage, who wowed audiences with his folk roots act at 2018's Blues at Broadbeach

An ARIA Hall of Famer, No. 1 artist, King of Pop and Aussie icon, Australian singer songwriter Russell Morris needs no introduction.

Morris shot to fame in the Melbourne band *Somebody's Image* with hits that included renditions of Joe South's *Hush* and Bob Dylan's *Baby Blue*.

The Real Thing, penned by Johnny Young, performed by Morris and produced by a young Ian "Molly" Meldrum was the biggest hit of 1969. It was added to the National Film and Sound Archive's Sounds of Australia registry in 2013.

Morris's hits of the 1960s and 70s included *Sweet Sweet Love*, *Wings of an Eagle*, *Rachel*, *Part 3 into Paper Wall* and *The Girl That I Love*.

Between 2012 and 2017, his trilogy of folk roots albums, *Sharkmouth*, *Van Diemen's Land* and *Red Dirt - Red Heart*, attracted rave reviews.

The 2019 album *Black and Blue Heart*, produced by Powderfinger's Bernard Fanning and Nick DiDia, was described as a return to rock for Morris.

Members can head to the Pitstop terminal at Twin Towns to access physical or electronic gift cards. These cards from a range of popular national retailers can be used for gifts, Christmas shopping, groceries or to stock up the fridge for the festive season with your favourite beers, wines or spirits.

VISA and EFTPOS cards are also

available. These can be used wherever accepted but a small transaction fee applies to VISA and EFTPOS card purchased via the Pitstop terminal.

If you would like to redeem your points for cards at Club Banora and Juniors, just ask the staff and they can arrange this for you.

The minimum value of the cards is \$50, for which you will need 5,000 points. Members can also use as little as \$20 worth of points to purchase Twin Towns gift cards during December. Twin Towns gift cards are valid for up to three years

and can be used at the Clubs for food and beverage purchases.

You can also spend your points at the Clubs ANYTIME for food, beverages, entertainment and more.



Keep an up-to-date copy in your car, on your phone or make sure it's with you at all times if you're walking. Be sure to keep up with any changes to border crossing restrictions as they occur.
