BACK ON TRACK

Torrential rain put a dampener on 1st on Wharf Tavern's renovations, with concreters finally finding the right weather to pour the driveway late last month.

Project Manager Scott McClintock from Tweed Coast-based construction company, TLF Developments, said they are hopeful April brings dryer weather and his team can resume work on the renos.

"Weather permitting, we should make up for some of the unexpected downtime and be on track for completion around late April." said Scott.

More than 20 local tradies are working on remodelling the laneway outside the Tavern, building a timber arbour at the entry and installing picture windows.

Twin Towns CEO Rob Smith said the Board is pleased so many local tradespeople are working on the project.

"We try to award contracts, wherever possible, to local companies. Over the past few years, we've offered a raft of projects to local companies, including TLF Developments.

"Another crew is working on renovations to hotel rooms at Mantra Twin Towns and DA approval has been received for the Harbour Terrace extension.

"There's lots more work in the pipeline for local trades," said Rob.

The Tweed Heads & Coolangatta RSL Sub-Branch will not be holding any of their annual ANZAC Day Services at Jack Evans Boat Harbour due to restrictions on events taking place. The community, as a family unit or individuals, can still share in remembering the sacrifices made by our service personnel in all conflicts, past and present, throughout the world.

I read an article recently about the history of the first World War, the ANZAC legend and the spirit of ANZAC. I have copied the contents below. More information can be found on the <u>Australian War Memorial website</u>.

"On the morning of 25 April 1915, the ANZACs set out to capture the Gallipoli peninsula in order to open the Dardanelles to the allied navies. The objective was to capture Constantinople (now Istanbul in Turkey), the capital of the Ottoman Empire, and an ally of Germany.

The ANZACs landed on Gallipoli and met fierce resistance from the Ottoman Turkish defenders. Their plan to knock Turkey out of the war quickly became a stalemate, and the campaign dragged on for eight months.

At the end of 1915, the allied forces were evacuated. Both sides suffered heavy casualties and endured great hardships. Over 8,000 Australian soldiers were killed. News of the landing on Gallipoli and the events that followed had a profound impact on Australians at home. The 25th of April soon became the day on which Australians remember the sacrifice of those who had died in the war.

The ANZACs were courageous and although the Gallipoli campaign failed in its military objectives, the Australian and New Zealand actions during the campaign left us all a powerful legacy."

A MESSAGE RE ANZAC DAY 2021

from the Tweed Heads & Coolangatta RSL Sub-Branch

Over the past few weeks, the Tweed Heads & Coolangatta RSL Sub-Branch Committee has assessed whether ANZAC Day commemorative activities could be compliant, as well as safe, especially for elderly veterans.

This assessment led to an earlier decision to cancel commemorations for 2021, based on the prevailing regulations at that time.

Recently, New South Wales and Queensland governments and RSL's issued updated guidelines for 2021 ANZAC Day commemorations. On review, the NSW requirements were still impractical for this Sub-Branch to hold a service at Tweed Heads.

Queensland guidelines were more liberal and provided the possibility of holding a COVIDSafe compliant commemoration in Queensland.

Subsequently, the Committee is planning for a small-scale commemoration in Queen Elizabeth II Park in Coolangatta at 11am on Sunday 25 April. This will comprise a march for members and veterans only within the park and a commemorative service at the cenotaph.

Details are being finalised and will be available on the Sub-Branch website.

Please remember that plans for the commemoration in Coolangatta are dependent on there being no further changes to Queensland guidelines in the lead up to ANZAC Day.

We acknowledge the disappointment shared by veterans and the local community at not having the usual ANZAC Day commemoration at Tweed Heads this year. The primary concern of the Sub-Branch Committee, however, is the health and safety of elderly veterans and members.



LIGHT UP THE DAWN

On ANZAC Day, the community is encouraged to pause and remember not only those lost, but all who came home and those who follow in their footsteps.

Last year's Light Up the Dawn initiative was a huge success and once again, it is hoped people will stand in their driveways, on their balconies or in their living rooms at 6am to commemorate ANZAC Day.

Whether you're in uniform or pyjamas, wearing medals, poppies or sprigs of rosemary, let Australia's veterans know that their service and sacrifice will never be forgotten.


