# COMMUNITY JUMPS THE GUN ON POOL CLOSURE

The Twin Towns Board of Directors are yet to determine the future of Oasis Pools Complex, despite a raft of negative publicity and criticism currently circulating across the Tweed.

The only decision that has been made to date is that the pool will close on 30 April for the winter period and to allow the Club to assess the aging and failing plant and equipment.

#### NEW MASTERPLAN FOR CLUB BANORA PRECINCT

Taking a step back, in 2009 the Club completed the last masterplan for Club Banora. That plan evolved out of the identified need for the Club to be sustainable in the long term.

This means being less reliant on our current income streams through diversity, making sure the scale of the Club facilities matched current demand and that the proposed services matched what the research said people would support and wanted as features of the Club.

In 2021, the Tweed Shire Council was successful in the Land and Environment Court in having our plans for a retail development and alterations to the Club's facilities refused.

The court's decision has given the Club a much greater insight into what is required to get the plans approved, and the need remains as relevant today as it did 13 years ago when the journey started. The plans, however, do need to be updated.

In December Club News, Board Chairman Brian Brown advised members in his monthly report that the Board

decided to create an entirely new masterplan for Club Banora. The new plan would include a reconfiguration of the Club's facilities, specifically tailored to the needs of the Banora Point community, especially local families, moving into the future.

In December, the Board engaged consultants and urban design specialists to prepare the new Club Banora masterplan.


The aim was to ensure the new masterplan would service the social and recreational needs of Banora Point residents for the next 10 to 20 years. It would be what the majority of people wanted and expected from their local Club.

Part of the research was to identify reasons people choose not to visit the Club, and what services and facilities would attract them to the Club, e.g. dining, entertainment and atmosphere.

The researchers talked with members and non-members in focus groups, analysed the local demography and the actual performance of each of the Club's areas using all the statistics which we gather in the daily running of the Clubs.

In the recent weeks they held workshops and finished with an online survey of members in the 2485 and 2486 postcodes only.

The consultants first report will be provided to the Board in March, following which we will commence the deliberation phase.

#### **OASIS POOLS**

When the pool was first imagined and constructed in the mid '80s, some may remember it had a grandstand on the western side, a bar and licensed beer garden and served food from the BBQ Hut on the eastern side. There was also regular weekend entertainment on the stage.

Those features were clearly before their time, or Banora and the pool did not then have sufficient population to make the complex viable, beyond swimming. If this is still the case in 2022 is something we are considering.

As the pools are now 35 years old, major pieces of plant and equipment have started to fail so the Club has made the decision to reimagine the Oasis Pools. This will be done as part of the new Club Banora-wide masterplan, where all other facilities, actual demand and modern expectations will also be factored into the outcomes.

It's well established that most pools are owned and operated by local government and funded by rates, which the Oasis Pools are not. Part of what the Club is doing is also looking at the model to make it more sustainable and if government, or others, have a part to play in that.

The Club has already applied for some one-off Federal funding for the immediate repairs, and we think Government does have a role to play in that space regardless of the ownership.

The long-term vision must precede or

at the very least, run alongside, detailed planning on matters like engineering and operational modelling.

While many in the community appear to have pre-determined the future for Oasis Pools, the Club has not. Once the initial planning has been completed, we'll be happy to share the next steps with all the members and the broader community.

A TWIN TOWNS CLUBGRANTS DONATION OF \$8,895 HAS ENABLED TWEED HEADS PUBLIC SCHOOL TO INTRODUCE A NEW INITIATIVE CALLED THE 'COUNTING FOR LIFE AT HOME', DESIGNED TO SUPPORT CHILDREN WITH THEIR NUMERACY.

Learning Links, who created the community education program for children with learning difficulties, said the At-Home Program will empower families with the skills, services and professional support they need to help their children to realise their potential.

The parents will learn about the program via Zoom sessions conducted by specialist childhood education professionals and will each receive a pack of activities and materials to assist with their child's development of numeracy skills. They will also have access to phone calls with a Learning Links Psychologist.

"If you haven't read the book each month, no stress, there's no pressure, come along anyway.


"The beer will still be cold and the conversation, we hope, will be lively. You'll soon get into the swing of it.


"There are no set rules, no age requirements, it's all about a relaxing time spent," said Marty.

# SUPERS ON THE SCREEN AT TWIN TOWNS

Highly regarded local photographer Craig Tuffin is currently exhibiting a new series of works titled The Supers at the Tweed Regional Gallery & Margaret Olley Art Centre.

Each of Craig's photographs tells a short story, which becomes a chapter in a larger novel that examines human potential. The exhibition seeks to depict those often unremembered faces of humanity as heroic versions of themselves.

One of the images included in the exhibition, pictured above, is a photograph Craig took of his then-pregnant wife during the first month of the COVID-19 outbreak.

"The characteristic levels of expectation

and anxiety that come with childbirth immediately transformed into fear," said Tuffin.

"We were trapped within our home with our unborn child at far greater risk than we could ever have anticipated.

"While I considered the possibility that I wouldn't be allowed to be present at our daughter's birth, my wife took it all in her stride."

Gallery Director Susi Muddiman OAM praised the works of Tuffin.

"Craig a great technical photographer, his works are also incredibly powerful."

"The pandemic has taught us that it's

the everyday people who are the actual heroes, and this exhibition celebrates that."

Craig is an artist and educator from Kingscliff. He has won numerous awards and has exhibited nationally and internationally.
