# **EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST INVITED**FOR DEVELOPMENT SITE AT CLUB BANORA

The recent appearance of a real estate sign at the tennis courts at Club Banora has piqued the interest of locals, who are all asking the question. "What's for sale?"

For sale is a 3.02 hectare parcel of land, the filled area adjoining the golf course. The area has long been slated for future development of Club Banora with a range of complementary opportunities investigated over the years.

At an Extraordinary General Meeting on 12 December 2019, members passed a Special Resolution to deem this area, earmarked for future development, 'non-core' property under Section 41E of the Registered Clubs Act.

This enabled the Board to make commercial decisions on the future use of this land when the time was right, based on the Club Banora masterplan and strategic planning for growth and diversification of the Clubs.

Twin Towns Board Chairman Brian Brown said the Clubs and facilities offered by the Twin Towns group are the result of solid, long-term planning and execution in a considered way, one that matches the evolution of the area.

"It's imperative for Twin Towns to grow and invest in their businesses to increase their financial sustainability and viability in the long term.


"As a Board, we are continually evaluating, redefining and reshaping the Club's assets to achieve the best possible outcomes for members.

"We believe now is the time to move forward with the sale of this land and have called for expressions of interest, potentially for a seniors' living community or aged care facility," said Brian.

The parcel of land adjoins and overlooks the Club Banora golf course and lake. The sale of the property is jointly managed by Savills and Republik Property.




In 2005, he was admitted to the International Softball Hall of Fame for his contribution and dedication to the development of world softball.


Called up for National Service in 1970, David was selected for Officer training and on completion, was allocated to Infantry Corps which marked the commencement of a military career spanning 28 years.






Five women set out on a camping trip, but only four of them emerge from the reserve, bruised and traumatised. The fifth woman is missing and a huge search begins.






With Covid-19 restrictions hampering trade and events in the Gold Coast's southern border region over the past two years, Flotsam is a commitment to better days to come.
