TWIN TOWNS EGM, TUESDAY 26 JULY, 7PM

TWIN TOWNS MEMBERS ARE ADVISED THAT AN EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING (EGM) WILL TAKE PLACE THIS MONTH. MEMBERS WHO ARE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE SHOULD HAVE RECEIVED THEIR MEETING NOTICE VIA EMAIL ON 27 JUNE. IF YOU HAVEN'T SEEN IT, CHECK YOUR INBOX OR <u>CLICK HERE</u> TO VIEW IT ONLINE.

WHY HOLD AN EGM?

The reason for the EGM is to determine whether members agree to an area of the golf course, which has been closed to the public for over eight years, becoming 'non core' property of Twin Towns Services Club Limited. Non core means that the land is not essential to the Club's activities.

This area of the course became unsafe and unplayable as a result of large-scale cracking of the surface and sub-surface in 2014. A Risk Assessment was conducted around this time but unfortunately, consultants were unable to identify a solution to mitigate the risk of injury to those using the course.

Experts predict more challenges may lay ahead for the course in the future, especially if we experience another serious drought. But it's important for members to know that Twin Towns is committed to maintaining and operating golf on the remaining parts of the course while it is still viable.

The area we're talking about is the orange section in the map below.



WHY IS THE LAND FOR SALE?

As most members already know, the Twin Towns Board is always seeking new ways for the Club to become less reliant on income from gaming and alcohol, both of which are shrinking markets. The Board strongly believes diversification is paramount to futureproofing the Twin Towns organisation for generations to come.

Over the years, this strategy has proved successful in generating and maintaining new sources of revenue for the organisation, such as the resort (The Sebel Twin Towns) and our motels in Mackay (Shakespeare Motel and Galaxy Motor Inn).

Importantly, this project, if approved, will form part of the overall diversification strategy, or master plan, for the entire Banora Point site, including Club facilities, sporting facilities and the proposed retail development.

WHO'S INTERESTED IN THE LAND?

At an EGM in December 2019, Twin Towns members voted in favour of a disused parcel of land at Club Banora becoming non core. A call for expressions of interest in developing the land took place earlier this year.

Over-50s lifestyle resort developers, GemLife, who saw the land as ideal for a seniors' living community, were identified as the preferred purchaser. The Board believes GemLife will be a good fit for Club Banora, and the local community as a whole.

Recently, GemLife indicated they wish to purchase a larger parcel of land than what was originally offered for sale by Twin Towns. They see potential in also developing the disused section of the golf course. While not suitable for golf, they believe it may be suitable for alternative development.

Under the Registered Clubs Act, members must also vote to determine whether this additional piece of land also becomes non core.

At this point, the sale has not been finalised. The purchaser would like to carry out further assessments of the disused section of the golf course, but before they commence, need to be sure the Club will be in a position to sell this land as a non core asset if they achieve favourable results.

LIKE TO KNOW MORE?

Ahead of the EGM on Tuesday 26 July, an Information Session will be held in the Twin Towns Showroom on Tuesday 12 July at 7pm. The session will be presented by Board Chairman Brian Brown and Twin Towns CEO Rob Smith.

The Federal election for the Party that will govern Australia for the next three years has been decided by the citizens eligible to vote.

I hope the winners, whichever political party they are, truly understand the trust being placed in them by all Australians, no matter which party they voted for.

We as a nation face some serious challenges ahead and Government will have to make some tough decisions for the good of all, not only those who supported them at the ballot box.

I was certainly surprised at the number of independents elected and hope they have the vision for the future and the wisdom required to deliver on the changes that were promised during the election.

The Labor Party has been delivered a majority and can form government without requiring support from the Greens or the Independents. This decision places enormous trust in them to deliver a better standard of open and transparent government and consideration of all Australians, no matter their political persuasion.

I find the way political parties operate confusing, due to the fact that the incumbent party try to convince the voters they are doing a great job of running the country.

Whereas the opposition try to cast the incumbent as irresponsible managers of

the country's economy and resources and they should be elected to government.

The promises made by both major parties when in opposition are rarely delivered upon. When the final result is declared, the opposition forms government and is provided with the current financial reports, the first press conference called informs the public that the economy is in worse shape than they were led to believe. Unfortunately, all the promises can't be delivered until the outlook improves. Call me cynical if you like but the situation seems to be happening more frequently within both political parties.

The Club, as a business, is a keen follower of politics and elections as the election result in 2010, and at other times, saw our industry thrown into turmoil and put our forward planning on hold. On this occasion a clear decision by the people is very welcome and we trust our first observations of a stable period of government for Clubs is realised.

The rain has finally stopped and the cleanup is well underway but we know from previous experience not all incidents are treated equally. All areas of our community that were affected have not been fully restored but have been caught up in the government red tape that always follows these natural disasters.

I am concerned at the discrepancies around the decision-making process - who will be repatriated first and in what priority are the remainder of the community then identified. I have some friends who are still waiting for insurance assessors to issue confirmation that their claim has been accepted and they can commence the task of rebuilding their lives.

The golf course at Club Banora was again impacted by the recent rain event and was once again closed for a couple of weeks. Like all golfers, me included, we think we haven't had that much rain, well not enough to close the course. Once you go and have a look, however, you can see the amount of water that is laying over the course and it will not dissipate for a long period of time.

The golf course will be undergoing some alterations in the coming month as the 16th hole will be rejuvenated to make the hole more player friendly than is the current situation.

Due to the pandemic and issues with cost blowouts, not being able to source structural building materials and tradespeople, the Juniors redevelopment has not commenced at this time and may not commence until early next year at the earliest. I will keep you informed as we move closer to a start date for the project.

The new DA for the shopping centre at Banora is progressing and will be submitted to Council for determination before the end of the current year. We are hopeful this will be approved within the next 12 months but don't hold your breath. We have been involved with Council many times and nothing seems to go to plan.

when they discovered the famous French chef, right there amongst them, enjoying a few beers and cheering on the Blues.


Game 1 may not have been the the Blues' night but for those who managed a selfie with Manu or an autograph, whether their team won or lost, that was the highlight of their night.





Twin Towns' Blokes, Books and Beers club invites you to get reading this month, then come along to the next get-together on Wednesday 27 July and tell us what you think.


