Twin Towns generously arranged for the Club to play at the halfway house at the Golf Club and when we outgrew that venue, went on to the upper level at Club Banora. They provided the Tuscany Room for congresses and other competitions and also arranged for refreshments.

The first President was J Rayner with a further eight Presidents over the next 30 years, ably supported by committees needed to run a Club successfully.

At Club Banora, the Bridge Club was very popular, with many members and visitors coming to play regularly, often with up to 18 tables in a session.

However, in 2010 when the upper level of Club Banora was closed, the Bridge Club moved to Juniors on Fraser Drive to a function room on the upper level where we played for nine years. This venue was less popular than was hoped.

Then, when unfortunately Covid 19 reared its ugly head, this further diminished our playing numbers. In 2021, members were offered the rooms at Club Banora Tennis Club where we continue to play Monday and Friday afternoons from 12 noon NSW.
