



BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



I would like to remind members that the 66th Annual General Meeting of Twin Towns Services Club will be held in the Showroom of the main Club in Wharf Street, Tweed Heads, on 23rd May 2023 at 7pm. I look forward to seeing you there and having the chance to catch up.

The items of business to be discussed include a very important resolution to alter a part of Club Banora building from core property to non-core property. This is required under the Registered Clubs Act before the property can be sold or a long-term lease entered into.

The first floor of Club Banora has not been operational for a significant period of time and the Club has identified an opportunity to utilise part of the first floor.

The Board has been approached by a local childcare provider to lease a part of the Club, which is no longer being used, to provide a much-needed childcare facility at Banora Point.

The proponent has identified a large influx of young families into the area, creating a shortage of these facilities close by.

The company is a well-respected childcare company and has a long-term lease with Twin Towns for a childcare centre on Club-owned land in Recreation Street, Tweed Heads.

The childcare facility will be established in the current footprint of Club Banora. I would also emphasize the fact for those concerned that they would have separate entry and exits to their respective premises and at no point will the two premises have access to each other.

Members' support for the resolution will allow the Club to engage with the childcare provider in securing a long-term lease for the premises.

A positive outcome will allow the Club to maximize the use of the premises and further diversify away from traditional income streams.

The Banora masterplan is almost ready to be presented to Council, after many delays due to interruptions and court appearances beyond our control.

This has been a long journey over more than 10 years after the initial plan was presented. I still remember the many meetings we attended in attempting to have the concept design agreed to by Council.

We are not there yet but at least the parties are consulting with each other to achieve a solution that both groups can agree to.

The time is right to have the plans approved and the development move forward to the benefit of the community of Banora Point and surrounding shires.

I wonder how many residents have noticed something missing from the corner of Leisure and Fraser Drives, Tweed Heads South? If you didn't see the demolition taking place, Twin Towns Juniors was demolished to make way for the brand-new, purpose-built Club that will open in early November.

Members will be kept informed on the progress of the construction and there are photos on the Club's website if you are interested.

Congratulations to the RSL Sub-Branch on the preparation and conducting of the annual ANZAC Day dawn service and main service at Chris Cunningham Park. Both services were a credit to all involved.

The weather looked a little inclement as the Dawn Service approached but the rain held off and clouds disappeared, making for a beautiful morning.

The number of families in attendance at the Dawn Service appears to increase each year as more and more people come to pay their respects to those who gave their lives so we can enjoy the freedom we have today. I was proud and honored to lay a wreath at the Main Service on behalf of members and staff of Twin Towns Services Club on this very special day.

MEMBERS TO VOTE AT AGM ON LEVEL 1 LEASING OPPORTUNITY FOR CLUB BANORA

AT THE AGM ON TUESDAY 23 MAY, TWIN TOWNS MEMBERS WILL VOTE TO DETERMINE WHETHER LEVEL 1 AT CLUB BANORA, WHICH HAS BEEN CLOSED FOR ALMOST 14 YEARS, WILL BECOME NON-CORE PROPERTY OF TWIN TOWNS SERVICES CLUB LIMITED.



Non-core means that the land is not essential to the Club's activities and allows the Board to enter into a lease for the space to be operated by an external operator.

Club Banora has never shown that the extra capacity provided by Level 1 was warranted, from 1986 when the Club was built, through to 1992 when the first level was fitted out and opened, until 2009 when it was permanently closed.

The costs of operating and staffing an additional floor at the Club could simply not be justified and even today, there is insufficient demand for more 'Club' space at Banora. Continued next page

Currently, overcrowding on the single ground level is never a problem, especially with the expansive outdoor facilities now in place.

Twin Towns has searched for an alternative use for the space but has been limited by Club Banora's land zoning. Whilst office space, shopping, medical or even a call centre could not be approved, a childcare centre is permissible under the zoning.

After 35 years, the Club has finally identified a suitable use for Level 1, childcare, which is in demand, generates income and is compatible to being at the centre of life in Banora Point. If approved, it will be built over half of the existing upstairs space on the western side of Level 1 and operated by an established partner.

Regardless, the Club can build and operate the facility but it's preferred that we engage with specialists rather than venture into this new industry.

The centre will have space for 94 children and families who use the childcare centre will be Twin Towns members.

The project is considered an integral generational component of diversification strategies aimed at ensuring the viability of the Twin Towns organisation into the future, as well as decreasing reliance on gaming as the Club's major source of revenue.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

At the recent Club Banora Redevelopment Community Engagement session, feedback was generally positive for the proposed childcare centre, with many indicating this service is much needed in the local community.

Some in attendance commented that they knew families who were unable to find placements for their children locally, due to the growing number of young families moving to Banora Point.

Overall, there was strong support from the community, particularly when the separation of the entrance to the childcare centre and its facilities from general members areas was explained.

CLUBS OFFERING CHILDCARE

Twin Towns CEO Rob Smith said several NSW Clubs have independently operated childcare facilities.

"Revesby Workers Club's 'The Treehouse' Early Childhood Centre, St Mary's Leagues Club's 'Go Bananas' Early Learning Centre and Bankstown Sports Club's 'Flinders Centre' Early Learning School are great examples of Clubs where childcare centres operate successfully.

"Locally, Tabatinga at Seagulls Club offers before and after school care, as well as vacation care.

"Like the proposed childcare centre at Club Banora, these are all independently operated and have their own separate access to and from the centres which doesn't intertwine with Club space," said Rob.

A Development Application has been submitted to Tweed Shire Council as part of Twin Towns' Club Banora Masterplan.

The non-core vote, if successful, will allow the Club to enter into an operating agreement with existing or other partners to provide professional childcare services on site as part of the Masterplan.

JUNIORS PROJECT ON TRACK

With demolition works now complete, it's full steam ahead for the construction of the new Juniors Clubhouse over upcoming months.

The work is being carried out by local building company, TLF Developments, who previously completed many successful projects for Twin Towns, including hotel room refurbishments at The Sebel Twin Towns, the Harbour Terrace Balcony, 1st on Wharf Tavern entry remodelling, the Banora alfresco and Juniors' outdoor Pavilions.

Project Manager, Scott McClintock from TLF Developments, said he is pleased with the progress to date and at this stage, construction is on track for a November opening.

"We expect the footings to be poured in early May and the structural steelwork should start going up in early June.

"Once this happens, locals will begin to see their new Clubhouse taking shape, week by week, as they drive past the site," said Scott.

An army of around 80 or more local tradies are expected to be involved in the Juniors project: concreters, carpenters, cabinetmakers, electricians, plumbers, plasterers, painters, landscapers, renderers, glaziers, roofers and more.

Twin Towns CEO Rob Smith said he and the Board of Directors were pleased to see this major contract awarded to a local company employing local trades.

"Money put back in the hands of the local community is money well spent and at \$12 million, it's a significant outlay.

"Employing locally is investing locally. As well as supporting local tradies, the project will also give back to many local companies who will supply the tonnes of building products required to complete the new Club," said Rob.

Twin Towns will provide members' updates as major milestones are reached during construction.


With the voice of an angel and humour from downunder, classical crossover singer Mirusia has won the hearts of millions of fans around the world.




