BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Annual General Meeting of Twin Towns Services Club Ltd was held on Tuesday 23 May 2023. I would like to thank the 95 members who attended the meeting to vote on the proposed resolutions put forward by the Board.

The Showroom, which can hold over 1,000 people, looked rather empty with the small number in attendance. It was a little disappointing considering the changes required to allow the leasing of the Childcare Centre to proceed at Club Banora.

I hope that this trend does not continue as a quorum is required before the AGM can commence. If the number of members is insufficient, the meeting must be rescheduled to a later date, causing a further delay in approving important resolutions to allow the Club to move forward.

I am sure that our conscientious members will return next year in greater numbers to have their say in their Club becoming stronger into the future.

There was no election required for the three Director positions and the nominees were duly declared elected unopposed.

I congratulate Bob Loring and Sharon Styman on being returned and welcome our new Director, Justin McGurgan who brings a wealth of knowledge of the industry to the Boardroom. The Directors duly elected will retain their positions for the next three years.

The members overwhelmingly supported the resolution to change part of the Club Banora building from Core property to Non-Core property. This will allow the portion of the Club identified on the plan to be developed into a childcare facility that will be altered to accommodate approximately 95 children.

The change will allow the Club to enter into a long-term lease with an approved childcare provider and further diversify its income stream from our traditional revenue base.

The change will add another dimension to the masterplan for the Club Banora precinct and will certainly reinforce the strategy of making Club Banora 'The Centre of life' for Banora Point residents.

I look forward to commencement of the development for the whole area as soon as Tweed Shire Council approves the Development Application, a process that usually takes a considerable amount of time. Let's hope it is finalised soon.

Talking about Development Application approval waiting times, as I was driving

to Juniors last week I passed the GemLife housing development on Fraser Drive and noticed that no houses have been built yet.

People who purchased these properties over 12 months ago would not be happy with the long delays prior to moving into their new homes. I wonder if this was another delay caused by Council.

The redevelopment of Juniors has commenced and is on track to be open for business in November. The new Club will be ready for the busy Christmas season giving members and visitors the opportunity to visit the new premises and facilities.

At the time of writing, the concrete slab has been poured and the Board has been informed the structure will start to take shape over the next few weeks. I will keep members advised of the progress at each stage of the development.

I would like to remind members about the wonderful network of internal clubs that exists within our Clubs, run by enthusiastic committee members who give up their time to ensure their smooth operation.

They are not just sporting clubs. There's Euchre, Bridge, Seniors Social and a Garden Club for all the green thumbs.

The social aspect and friendship are paramount in all our internal clubs so come along and meet the people involved. This beats the heck out of staying at home all the time.

At Twin Towns AGM in May, members voted unanimously to endorse a resolution that saw retired Twin Towns Board Director Ross O'Leary honoured with Life Membership.

Ross was elected to the Board in 2008, where he has been an active participant until his resignation in February 2023. During this time, he was a representative on many of the Board's internal sub-committees where he was respected for his participation and enthusiasm.

In his younger years, Ross trained to become a butcher. He was also an avid Rugby League player.

THE PERFECT PLATE AT TWIN TOWNS

THE NSW CLUB INDUSTRY'S PREMIER COOKING COMPETITION IS ON NOW AND EXECUTIVE CHEF DAVID ORGAN IS PRESENTING AN INDULGENT SEAFOOD DISH AS TWIN TOWNS 'PERFECT PLATE'.

David's Perfect Plate this year is King Prawns, barrel wrapped with Jamón Serrano. Some may have tried this dish last month when it made its popular debut as a signature Mother's Day main in Harbour Fresh.

The fresh, local trawler King prawns are barrel wrapped with Jamón Serrano, a Spanish-style, slow-aged ham made from a hind pork leg cut. The secret to Jamón Serrano's flavour lies in its delicate aging process, and the addition of one simple ingredient - sea salt.

The prawns are served on a colourful bed of honey-chilli baby beets and goat feta, topped with a delicious burnt butter, orange and sage cream sauce.

TWIN TOWNS 'HIGHLY COMMENDED' FOR FUNDING LOCAL SCHOOL GARDEN PROJECT

Club representatives from across NSW came together at the Clubs NSW Clubs & Community Awards last month to celebrate their contributions to local communities.

Clubs in regional and metropolitan areas were recognised for a diverse range of initiatives, including Club Central Hurstville who created a special program to help disadvantaged children further their education and gain access to employment opportunities.

Broken Hill Musicians Club saved the only cinema in a regional town from having to close its doors and Cronulla RSL are funding the veterinary care and support of a retired military working dog.

Twin Towns received the Highly Commended Award in the Education category for its funding of Banora Point High School Special Education Unit's Garden Project.

The Club's financial assistance enabled the school to build an outdoor garden - an inclusive, engaging and stimulating environment for students with disabilities and special learning and sensory needs.

The school received a total of \$47,500 for their project through ClubGRANTS, including \$29,500 from Twin Towns.

After Twin Towns Board Directors saw first-hand the passion and commitment for the project shown by teachers, an additional \$10,500 was donated from the Club's philanthropic


ClubsNSW Acting CEO Sallianne Faulkner said Clubs are always looking for new ways to make their communities better places to live.

NEW JUNIORS CLUBHOUSE GETS OFF THE GROUND

Construction of the new Juniors Clubhouse is currently on track for completion in November and locals who drive by the site regularly would see how quicky the project can progress, just in the space of a week.

A major milestone was reached last month when truckloads of steel trays were transported from a company in Yatala and placed in position, ready for the pour of the concrete slab at the end of May.


Now the slab is down, the next stage commences in June with the construction of the steel walls and roofing frames.

The new building will be raised around a metre and a half off the ground to ensure flooding issues which have plagued the Club for decades remain a thing of the past.

Although the design of the new Clubhouse will be contemporary, elements that worked well and members enjoyed most about the old Club will be refreshed, including the outdoor pavilion.

For the past six-plus decades, Twin Towns has strategically invested, reinvested and grown the organisation, its Clubs, assets, services and facilities for the benefit of members.

This successful strategy continues to evolve as the new Juniors Club progresses towards its reopening later this year.





TWIN TOWNS TURNS RED FOR HAEMOCHROMATOSIS WEEK

Along with around 100 well-known buildings and landmarks across Australia, the exterior of Twin Towns turns red every evening from 1-7 June, shining a light on an extremely common genetic condition that most people have never heard of.

It's called haemochromatosis, and Beethoven, Ernest Hemmingway and Dave Hughes all developed the condition, also known as Iron Overload.

Most people know anaemia causes tiredness and lethargy from too little iron in your blood but the same symptoms are caused by having too much iron stored in your body.

The hereditary condition, which is passed on from both biological parents, is simple to detect and treat but if undiagnosed or ignored can lead to serious and lifethreatening illness.

One in seven Australians carry a

mutation of the defective genes and one in 200 Australians have an increased chance of developing the disorder.

Unfortunately, most of those affected aren't diagnosed until aged in their mid-forties and already suffering ill health. Once diagnosed, the treatment for haemochromatosis requires regular removal of blood known as a venesection and in most cases, the blood can be donated to help others.
