

A NEW CHAPTER BEGINS FOR THE MUCH-LOVED LOCAL

In February this year, Twin Towns announced that Juniors would close in early April to make way for the construction of a new Clubhouse. With a project of this size, it was ambitious at the time to say it would be completed by mid-November.

Well, November has arrived and thanks to Tweed construction company TLF Developments and their massive team of local tradies. it will soon become a reality.

Members and visitors will soon get to enjoy the new contemporary and spacious surrounds at Juniors, encompassing around 1,200 square metres of internal space and 700 square metres of covered outdoor areas.

Jr's Kitchen also opens this month and diners can choose to sit inside or outdoors on the balcony. The menu will include bistro classics and

popular modern Asian dishes.

The bar will have 16 beers on tap and a wide range of local and international beverages.

On Thursday 30 November, the Christmas Ham Raffles kick off at Juniors so you have the perfect excuse to visit the new Club and check it out. Tickets are on sale from 12pm NSW: hams are drawn from 6pm NSW.

Locals will also be excited to hear that free live music commences at the new Juniors in December and will continue into the new year.

Juniors entertainment will be on Fridays from 5pm NSW, Saturdays from 6pm NSW and Sundays from 3pm NSW.

To celebrate the opening, Juniors is giving away a Ford Ranger Wildtrak valued at \$75,000.

When you visit Juniors after it opens, earn one ticket per day in the draw with a food purchase and one ticket per day with a beverage purchase.

In February next year, you could be parking your new Ford Ranger Wildtrak at the door of the new Juniors.

TWIN TOWNS' MAJOR BOOST TO NEW CLONTARF FOUNDATION ACADEMY AT SOUTH TWEED

A \$20,000 DONATION FROM THE TWIN TOWNS SERVICES COMMUNITY FOUNDATION WILL FUND THE ENROLMENT OF AN ADDITIONAL 10 BOYS AT THE CLONTARF FOUNDATION'S RECENTLY OPENED ACADEMY AT TWEED RIVER HIGH SCHOOL.

The Clontarf Foundation is an organisation that improves the education, discipline, self-esteem, life skills and employment prospects of young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men.

The Academies work in partnership with local schools, focusing on attendance, behavioural change and positive attitudes, which leads to students completing school and finding secure employment.

Clontarf Foundation's NSW Partnerships Manager, James Grant, explained that whilst the passion that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander boys have for football attracts them to the Academies, they are offered more than just a sporting program.

"Our three full-time staff at the Tweed River High School Academy coordinate a diverse range of activities; they mentor and counsel students, while teachers cater for their educational needs.

"There is morning training, afternoon activities, camps, big days out and more to keep the boys active and engaged.

"For example, this morning we held our morning training at Snapper Rocks. The boys participated in beach flags, played a game of footy on the beach, then it was in the showers and off to class.

"Every Academy does this sort of thing."

James said Twin Towns Services Community Foundation's support of the Tweed River High School program allows them to work closely within the community, provide the boys with career opportunities and enables the boys to give back through community engagement.

"The support received from Twin Towns is a welcome introduction of Clontarf into the region and we look forward to working together to provide opportunities for our boys to become strong community contributors," said James.

Twin Towns Services Community Foundation Chairman, David Phillips, said the Clontarf Foundation was an amazing organisation and the work they do with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander kids is "exemplary".

"We're thrilled to be in a position to help the local Clontarf Foundation Academy through our Community Foundation and we look forward to building on this relationship in the future.

"I encourage everyone to visit their <u>website</u> to learn more about the success of their Academies right across Australia," said David.

The Twin Towns Services Community Foundation is Twin Towns' philanthropic arm, which funds worthwhile projects in the community, over and above what is provided through ClubGRANTS.

On the first anniversary of the armistice in 1919, one minute's silence was instituted as part of the main commemorative ceremony. After the end of World War 2 in 1945, the Australian and British Governments changed the name to Remembrance Day as an appropriate title for a day which would commemorate all war dead.



Prochazka has a 3-0 record in the UFC with 13 straight wins overall while former middleweight champion Pereira has won five of six UFC fights.

Former light heavyweight champion and Czech Republic native Procházka has not had a fight since beating Teixeira to take out the UFC light heavyweight belt in June 2022. He's never lost a championship but was forced to relinquish his title late last year due to injury.

Brazil native Pereira, who now lives and trains in the US, knocked out Adesanya last year to win the middleweight title, only for Adesanya to knock him out to reclaim the belt in April this year.

The sparks will surely fly when two of the most exciting 'big men' of UFC go head-to-head for the vacant light heavyweight title.
