Thanks to internet for this interesting snippet: The world's largest flower is the Rafflesia arnoldii? It is a rare and endangered species of flowering plant that is native to the rainforests of Sumatra and Borneo. The flower can grow up to three feet in diameter and weigh up to 24 pounds! It is also known for its

pungent odour, which has been compared to that of rotting meat. The unpleasant odour (to humans not to flies) serves its purpose of carrying pollen from male to female flowers. These flies feed on animal carcasses so they naturally get attracted to a rotting flesh odour (but not to fragrant smells).
